# COMPETITION REGULATIONS

The Regulations of the BRI Super League – Season 2025/26 are enacted by PSSI with the approval of the PSSI Executive Committee and shall take effect as of the date of their adoption.

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## DEFINITION

Unless otherwise specified, specific terms in this BRI Super League – 2025/26 Regulations are defined as follows:

**Accreditation Card (ID Card)** is any physical item issued by I.League and/or the recipient organization that provides authorization to access a controlled access area (or part thereof), where such area is under the control of I.League.

**Agent** or Intermediary is a professional who represents a football player to introduce him to a club (or vice versa) and/or manages other activities, such as negotiating agreements, contracts, or player transfers between clubs. An agent must obtain a FIFA authorization through the Football Association of Indonesia (PSSI), subject to applicable regulations.

**Asian Football Confederation (AFC)** is an Asian football confederation officially formed in Manila, Philippines, on May 8, 1954.

**Assistant Video Assistant Referee (AVAR)** is a referee with an AVAR license who acts as a match official and assists the VAR referee in monitoring and assessing potential incidents on the field of play. This match official works within the VOR.

**BRI Super League** is the BRI Super League competition for the 2025/26 season, which is the highest level of football competition participated in by members of the PSSI.

**Champion** is the member Club that wins in the competition.

**Club** is a member of PSSI that has met the requirements set by the PSSI to participate in a professional football competition held by PSSI and I.League.

**Compliment ticket** is a ticket officially issued by the Organizing Committee and given for free to certain parties, including, but not limited to, sponsors, relevant governments and so on, according to the Organizing Committee's policy.

**Elite Pro Academy (EPA)** is a football competition for several age groups, namely U16, U18, and U20, and all of the participants are members of PSSI.

**E-startlist** is an electronic match start list that is accessible through LIAS.

**Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA)** is the world football federation founded on May 21, 1904, in Paris.

**Field of Play (FOP) Area** is an area where the game is played, containing the playing surface and the surrounding area, defined within the stadium accreditation zone.

**Field of Play** is an area explained in Law 1 of the game rules issued by the International Football Association Board (IFAB) or *Dewan Asosiasi Sepak Bola Internasional*.

**Football Association of Indonesia (PSSI)** is the head organization of the association of football, futsal, and beach soccer throughout the territory of the Republic of Indonesia, which was founded on April 19, 1930, in Yogyakarta. PSSI is the only national football organization with authorization to regulate, manage, and organize all football, futsal, and beach soccer activities or competitions in Indonesia.

**Force Majeure** is any events or circumstances that prevents the fulfillment of any performance or provision of this Regulation arising or caused by acts, events, omissions, or accidents that are beyond the reasonable control of either party, including but not limited to abnormal bad weather, floods, lightning, storms, fires, explosions, earthquakes, structural damage, epidemics, and other natural events, failure or shortage of electricity supply, war, terrorist acts, military operations, riots, mass disorder, strikes, lockouts, other industrial actions, and civil unrest, disease outbreaks (epidemic and/or pandemic), regulations, orders, or instructions issued by the government.

**I.League** is PT Liga Indonesia Baru, a corporation established under the laws of the Republic of Indonesia and authorized by the Minister of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia. I.League is authorized by the Indonesian Football Association (PSSI) to manage professional football competitions and tournaments in Indonesia.

**International Transfer Certificate (ITC)** is a document issued by a FIFA member association/federation to confirm that a Player listed in the ITC and registered with the federation that issued the ITC (the original federation) is legally transferring to another federation (the new federation). The ITC is issued at the request of the federation that oversees the Player at the (new) Club, where the club is a member of that federation.

**Kits** is a term for clothing worn by Players, goalkeepers, who join the competition, typically consisting of a jersey (shirt), shorts, and socks.

**Laws of the Game (LOTG)** is a set of game rules that every player must obey. The rules are issued by the International Football Association Board (IFAB), a governing body responsible for establishing the current LOTG, which is the 2025/26 edition.

**Liga Indonesia Administration System (LIAS)** is a software or administration platform used and managed by I.League to organize information and administration about a competition.

**Manual** is a specific guidance on organizing the Super League, Championship, and EPA competitions, detailing the instructions and procedures required to fulfill the specifications outlined in these Regulations, which become an integral part of these Regulations.

**Match Decision Authority** is an independent body established by the I.League, which makes urgent decisions regarding Matches in extreme circumstances.

**Match** is a football match played according to the LOTG in the BRI Super League competition - 2025/26.

**Match Officials** are individuals appointed as the match commissioner, referee assessor, referee, assistant referee, fourth official, VAR referee, AVAR, and/or other individuals appointed by the PSSI and/or I.League.

**Match Schedule** is the official schedule detailing the dates and times of the Matches, the Stadiums to be used, and the names of the participating Clubs.

**National Dispute Resolution Chamber Indonesia (NDRC Indonesia)** is a body officially appointed and established by the PSSI and recognized in applicable FIFA regulations to handle disputes through arbitration related to contractual relationships, with the scope of resolution falling within the authority of the NDRC Indonesia. The decisions made by the NDRC are considered final and binding.

**Official** is a person involved in the participating Club of the BRI Super League and is registered in the BRI Super League competition for the 2025/26 season.

**On-Field Review (OFR)** is an activity performed by the referee to assess an incident on the RRA monitor.

**Local Organizing Committee** is the Local Organizing Committee for the Match established by the Club, responsible to the Club, led by and consisting of competent personnel who act as organizers of the Match and comply with the work provisions regulated in the Manual and Regulations.

**Player** is a person who has the necessary skills to play football and is registered to participate in competitions and tournaments organized by the PSSI and/or I.League, as regulated in RSTP (Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players).

**PSSI Disciplinary Code** is a set of regulations issued by PSSI to regulate behavior and discipline, as stated in Article 3 of the 2023 PSSI Disciplinary Code, to ensure the integrity, smooth running of matches, and security of Indonesian football.

**PSSI Disciplinary Committee** is an independent official body within the PSSI organizational structure that handles violations of the rules and disciplinary provisions that apply in national football under PSSI.

**PSSI Ethics Committee** is an independent body within the PSSI that maintains integrity, ethics, and morality in accordance with the PSSI Code of Ethics in all Indonesian football activities under PSSI.

**Referee Review Area (RRA)** is a designated area for referees to review incidents during the Play. It is located pitchside near the technical areas.

**Regulation** is a set of rules for organizing the BRI Super League competition - 2025/2026.

**Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players (RSTP)** is a regulation issued by FIFA regarding Player regulations, known as FIFA Regulations on the Status and Transfer of Players (January 2025 Edition).

**Replay Operator (RO)** is a licensed individual who assists the VAR and AVAR referees to prepare video replays with the best camera angles to review incidents occurring in the field of play. The RO works within the VOR.

**Rondo** is a training method to improve a player's passing ability. This method is applied to all levels of football players and is usually performed during warm-ups before matches.

**Round** is a marker of a period for a distinct phase or segment of play, or a specific duration at the end of the game.

**Sistem Informasi Administrasi PSSI (SIAP)** is a software or administration platform used and managed by the PSSI to organize information and administration about a competition.

**Stadium** is a venue that has met the requirements of and been approved by the PSSI for the BRI Super League competition, consisting of an indoor area and the outermost fence or perimeter as the boundary of the stadium area, as specified in the provisions of the 2021 PSSI Safety and Security Regulations.

**Standings** are the rankings of each Club during the BRI Super League competition.

**Technical Study Group (TSG)** is a division that focuses on the technical aspects of Matches, including direct or indirect observation, data collection and statistical analysis, Match and Player analysis, determining the man of the match, and submitting a technical report in written and audio-visual form to be published in the media.

**Ticket** is a document officially issued by the Organizing Committee in the form of, but not limited to, a sheet of paper, a bracelet, or an electronic format that provides entry access to the stadium area and to watch a football match. The ticket indicates the provisions that must be obeyed by the ticket owner.

**Video Assistant Referee (VAR)** is a system designed to assist referees on the field in making decisions using video footage, according to the established VAR protocols. The VAR device is located in the VAR Operation Room (VOR) in the stadium or a mobile van.

**Video Operation Room (VOR)** is a video operations room used by referees, assistant referees, and licensed ROs to live review incidents on the pitch during the match using multiple screens.

**VIP/VVIP** are guests of honor invited by the Organizing Committee to attend the Competition.

# I. BRI SUPER LEAGUE

## ARTICLE 1

### SCOPE

This regulation stipulates the rights, obligations, duties and responsibilities of all parties participating and involved in the BRI Super League.

## ARTICLE 2

### ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

1. I.League is responsible for organizing the BRI Super League, with the authority derived from the PSSI Statutes.
2. The responsibilities of I.League include but are not limited to:
  - a. supervise the preparations for the BRI Super League;
  - b. implement the PSSI decision regarding the format and participants of the BRI Super League;
  - c. determine the BRI Super League match schedule;
  - d. report any disciplinary violations in the BRI Super League to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee;
  - e. submit a report regarding the Club's resignation to PSSI, as stipulated in Articles 8 and 9 of these Regulations;
  - f. decide the status of the Match in the event of a postponement or cancellation due to Force Majeure, absence of the Club at the Match venue, or match suspension, according to the provisions of Articles 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 of these Regulations.
3. All decisions made by the I.League, according to these Regulations, are final and cannot be appealed.
4. All decisions made by the PSSI Disciplinary Committee and/or the PSSI Ethics Committee related to the BRI Super League refer to the PSSI Disciplinary Code, PSSI Code of Ethics, and the applicable BRI Super League competition regulations.

Disputes over the technical aspects of a Match and emergencies in the BRI Super League will be resolved and decided by the Match Decision Authority, consisting of elements from PSSI and I.League, with specific details of provisions to be determined at a later date.

## ARTICLE 3

### PARTICIPANT CLUBS

1. Clubs that are eligible to participate in the BRI Super League are members of PSSI and comply with membership procedures and rules. Changes in club ownership require an evaluation process and written approval from the PSSI, according to the PSSI's Membership Regulations.
2. The obligations and responsibilities of the Club are regulated in the Participating Team Agreement (PTA), along with policies, decisions, guidelines, appeals and circulars made by PSSI and/or I.League.
3. Clubs are required to complete and return the PTA to the I.League by email and registered post to the I.League office address before the specified deadline.
4. Clubs are responsible for ensuring that the I.League has received the original copy of the PTA by the specified deadline. Delays in submitting the original copy of the PTA may result in the cancellation of the Club's participation.
5. Every Club participating in the BRI Super League must ensure that every personnel registered as an Official in each Match understands and complies with the provisions specified in the PTA.
6. Clubs are obliged to fully support the National Team program by releasing their registered players according to the PSSI regulations. Club coaches must sign a declaration of commitment to support the National Team program on an LIAS form as a requirement for approval.
7. Violations of paragraph (6) will be subject to sanctions according to the PSSI Disciplinary Code.
8. Every Club agrees and commits to the following:
  - a. understand and comply with all regulations, policies, decisions, guidelines, appeals, and circulars made by PSSI and I.League;
  - b. understand and comply with the LOTG;
  - c. accept that all administrative, disciplinary, and refereeing matters related to the BRI Super League will be resolved by PSSI and/or I.League, in accordance with the PSSI Regulations and Disciplinary Code;
  - d. respect the spirit and principles of fair play;
  - e. promote and respect the principle of integrity by not engaging in any form of betting or gambling related to football, including soliciting, facilitating, or attempting to facilitate the commission of such illegal activity;
  - f. do not tolerate any form of manipulation, such as offering, attempting to offer, accepting or seeking bribes, and influencing the outcome or any other aspect of the Match.;

- g. compete and play the strongest team during the BRI Super League;
  - h. compete in every Match and adhere to the regulations and schedule set by I.League;
  - i. participate and play in all BRI Super League matches at the stadium that has met the criteria and determined by PSSI and I.League;
  - j. as both the host Club and the away Club, responsible for the behavior of Players, Officials, spectators, and all related parties during the BRI Super League;
  - k. attend and participate in all official activities, such as owner's meeting, manager's meeting, match coordination meeting, press conference, media activities, social responsibilities activities, awarding nights, and other official activities organized by the I.League;
  - l. before the BRI Super League starts, submit documents to I.League, consisting of statistics, information, photos of each Player and Official, information about the Club, photos of the Stadium for BRI Super League, and other data or information requested by I.League;
  - m. provide the latest information related to changes in name, status, administration, data and other matters to I.League no later than 14 working days after the change;
  - n. not represent PSSI and/or I.League in any activity without prior written approval from PSSI and/or I.League;
  - o. especially for the host club, it is mandatory to prepare the match as efficiently as possible accordance with the provisions specified in the Regulations and Manual.;
  - p. the host club is also obliged to guarantee that access into the stadium for the Match Officials, PSSI delegates, I.League delegates, away club players and Officials, sponsors and media crews is not obstructed or restricted and prohibit any form of discrimination, threats, and pressure;
  - q. the host club is responsible for handling the licensing process for each home match and is required to submit to the I.League a permit letter or recommendation from the police or other authorized party.
9. Clubs guarantee, release, and discharge I.League against any claims from any party and declares that the Clubs are fully responsible for any accidents, damages, and other losses that may arise regarding the Matches organized by the Clubs.
10. The Clubs guarantee that no part of the payment from the I.League to the Club may be used, either directly or indirectly or through any means whatsoever, (i) for purposes that violate the laws and regulations of the Republic of Indonesia or any other country whose laws may apply to either party or their respective affiliates, (ii) to obtain any benefit from any government official or (iii) for any illegal, unethical or improper purpose, whether related or unrelated to the I.League. The Clubs also guarantee that the funds will not be used in a manner that violates the provisions herein.

11. A club, whether in its name or others acting on its behalf, is prohibited from discrediting or attacking other clubs, PSSI, and the I.League in any form. Violations of this clause may result in sanctions specified in the PSSI Disciplinary Code and the PSSI Code of Ethics.

## ARTICLE 4

### MATCH OFFICIALS

1. The BRI Super League Match Officials consist of a referee, 2 (two) assistant referees, a fourth official, a match commissioner, a referee assessor, a VAR referee and an AVAR.
2. The referee in the VOR is tasked with using recorded replays to help the main referee on the pitch make decisions, adhering to the established VAR protocol.
3. The duties, authority, and responsibilities of the Match Officials refer to the LOTG.
4. Match Officials are assigned by PSSI according to the PSSI Statutes.
5. I.League covers all costs associated with the assignment of Match Officials.

## ARTICLE 5

### SAFETY AND SECURITY

1. The host club is responsible for planning and implementing a safety and security system during the BRI Super League in all related areas, including the control access area, as well as ensuring the protection of all personnel and equipment:
  - a. Players and officials;
  - b. Match Officials;
  - c. VAR operational equipment;
  - d. press/media crew;
  - e. sponsors and commercial partners;
  - f. fans and spectators.
2. Each Club is responsible for the behavior of Players, Officials, personnel, fans/spectators, and other related parties during the BRI Super League.
3. The host club is responsible for ensuring safety and security before, during and after the Match.

4. The host club is obliged to prepare a security plan containing statements from all related parties at the stadium and the away team's hotel, as well as match officials, according to the 2021 PSSI Safety & Security Regulations. The club is also obliged to participate in training programs held by PSSI and/or the I.League regarding security plan.
5. Spectators, media, TV production teams and/or other individuals around the Stadium are prohibited from using drones or other flying objects during official training and/or official matches, except with permission from the I.League.
6. The host club is responsible for any violations of paragraph (5) mentioned above and can be subject to a minimum fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million rupiah), or a heavier sanction for repeated violations.
7. During the transition period of national football transformation, away club supporters are not permitted to attend all national football matches, including competitions. In this case, the club concerned is responsible for the attendance of those supporters.
8. Local Organizing Committee must take anticipatory measures to prevent the presence of away club supporters by preparing a safety & security plan according to the 2021 PSSI Safety and Security Regulations.
9. Clubs must demonstrate concrete steps to comply with the provisions in paragraph (8) above, supported by planning and implementation documents, as well as activity reports.
10. Clubs participating in the competition are required to comply with any government decisions or directives conveyed through the Indonesian National Police and/or related authorized agencies regarding spectator restrictions to optimize security concentration during activities involving a certain number of people.
11. Any violation of paragraph (7) of this Article will be subject to a minimum fine of IDR 25,000,000 (twenty-five million rupiah), or a heavier sanction for repeat violations. This sanction can be waived if the host club can prove that all anticipatory measures have been taken accordance with the 2021 PSSI safety and security regulations, supported by sufficient evidence. The club or other related parties may be given other sanctions, in addition to the fines (a stern warning, emptying a portion of the stadium, or matches behind closed doors).

## II. PARTICIPANTS AND COMPETITION SYSTEM

### ARTICLE 6

#### PARTICIPANTS

1. Participants of the BRI Super League are determined based on the results of the BRI Liga 1 - 2024/25 competition, Pegadaian Liga 2 - 2024/25 and PSSI decisions by considering aspects related to sporting merit and national Club licensing regulated by PSSI.
2. The BRI Super League participants consist of 18 (eighteen) Clubs, namely:
  - Arema FC
  - Bali United FC
  - Bhayangkara Presisi Lampung FC
  - Borneo FC Samarinda
  - Dewa United Banten FC
  - Madura United FC
  - Maluku United FC
  - PERSEBAYA Surabaya
  - PERSIB Bandung
  - PERSIJA Jakarta
  - PERSIJAP Jepara
  - PERSIK Kediri
  - PERSIS Solo
  - PERSITA
  - PSBS Biak
  - PSIM Yogyakarta
  - PSM Makassar
  - Semen Padang FC

## ARTICLE 7

### COMPETITION SYSTEM

1. BRI Super League matches are played in a double round-robin system, where each Club will compete against each other Club twice based on the Match Schedule.
2. The duration of the Match is specified in the LOTG and Article 25 of the Regulations.
3. The points earned by Clubs are determined by the results of their Matches, namely:
  - a. wins, the winning club earns 3 (three) points;
  - b. draws, both clubs earn 1 (one) point each;
  - c. losses, the losing club earns 0 points.
4. The ranking in the standings is determined as follows:
  - a. the number of points earned by the Club from the results of the Matches;
  - b. if there are 2 (two) or more clubs with the same number of points, the ranking will be determined based on the following criteria and order:
    - i. head-to-head, with the following order of criteria:
      - a) the higher number of points earned by each Club from Matches played only between Clubs with the same number of points;
      - b) higher goal difference of each Club from Matches played only between Clubs that have the same number of points;
      - c) the number of goals scored by each Club in Matches played only between Clubs with the same number of points.

The above criteria apply if all teams concerned have the same points, number of matches, and number of meetings. If the head-to-head procedure still fails to determine the ranking for Clubs with the same number of points, a tie-breaker will apply, by re-implementing the procedures in points a) to c) above, specifically for 2 (two) or more Clubs with the same number of points. If this tie-breaker fails to determine the ranking because the results are still the same, all calculations from the results of the head-to-head procedure and the tie-breaker are canceled, and the position is reset to the beginning before the head-to-head procedure. And then the following provisions apply.

- ii. the goal difference of the Clubs concerned in all Matches;
- iii. the number of goals scored by each Club in all Matches;
- iv. Lower point than the total points obtained from yellow cards and red cards in all Matches (according to Appendix 1 regarding the determination of fair play rankings);
- v. draw, with the mechanism to be determined by the I.League.

5. The top ranking and all positions that follow in the standings will proportionally receive a quota to represent Indonesia in the 2026/27 AFC Club Competitions, according to the provisions set by PSSI and AFC and obtaining a license in the 2025/26 AFC Club Licensing Cycle process.
6. The club that achieves the first position in the final standings of the 2025/26 BRI Super League will be declared the BRI Super League Champion.
7. Clubs ranked 16 (sixteen), 17 (seventeen), and 18 (eighteen) in the final standings of the 2025/26 BRI Super League will be relegated to the Championship for the 2026/27 season.

## ARTICLE 8

### WITHDRAWS FROM COMPETITION BEFORE IT HAS COMMENCED

1. Clubs that withdraws or are expelled from the BRI Super League before it has commenced can be replaced by other clubs.
2. PSSI is responsible for handling matters related to the Club's resignation before the commencement of the BRI Super League, including but not limited to:
  - a. replace the withdrawal Club with another football Club, which is a member of PSSI; and/or
  - b. change technical regulations, including this Regulation.
3. All decisions made by PSSI, based on paragraph (2) of this Article, are final and cannot be appealed.
4. The club withdraws exactly 30 days or more before the commencement of BRI Super League will be given a fine of IDR 1,000,000,000 (one billion rupiah).
5. The club withdraws in less than 30 days before the commencement of BRI Super League will be given a fine of IDR 2,000,000,000 (two billion rupiah).
6. The PSSI Disciplinary Committee has the power to impose additional sanctions on clubs withdraws before the commencement of BRI Super League.

## ARTICLE 9

### WITHDRAWS FROM A COMPETITION AFTER IT HAS COMMENCED

1. Clubs that withdraw from the BRI Super League after it has commenced will be subject to the following:
  - a. All scores of matches played by the withdrawal Club will be cancelled and declared invalid. Points and goals from those matches, for both the Club and its opponents, will not be counted in the final standings and will be removed from the BRI Super League standings;
  - b. All scheduled Matches of the withdrawal Club will be cancelled;
  - c. The withdrawal club is obliged to pay compensation for any losses incurred and suffered by the other club, PSSI, I.League, sponsors, television stations, and other related parties. The amount of compensation will be determined by the I.League;
  - d. The withdrawal club is disqualified from the BRI Super League for the next 2 (two) seasons and can only play in competitions determined by PSSI;
  - e. The withdrawal club will be fine IDR 3,000,000,000 (three billion rupiah) if it withdraws in round 1 (one) (in Match weeks 1 to 17), or a fine of IDR 5,000,000,000 (five billion rupiah) if it withdraws in round 2 (two) (in Match weeks 18 to 34);
  - f. The withdrawal club will be reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee for additional sanctions.;
  - g. The withdrawal club is required to return all contributions received related to the BRI Super League.
2. The provisions of Article 8 and Article 9 do not apply to Force Majeure declared by PSSI, I.League, and the government of the Republic of Indonesia.
3. PSSI and I.League have the authority to take necessary actions in cases arising from Force Majeure.

# III. PLAYERS AND OFFICIALS

## ARTICLE 10

### PLAYERS

1. Clubs are obliged to ensure that all Players meet the following requirements:
  - a. registered in the Club and PSSI according to RSTP and applicable PSSI Regulations;
  - b. registered in the I.League, based on an application by the Club, subject to the provisions of the Competition Regulations.
2. Individuals who meet the criteria in paragraph (1) of this Article are declared as Players who are eligible to play in the BRI Super League.
3. Players are declared ineligible if:
  - a. They violate paragraph (1) of this Article;
  - b. They violate paragraphs (2) and (4) of Article 14;
  - c. They play in a match contrary to the regulations and/or decisions of the PSSI Disciplinary Committee; or
  - d. I.League finds invalid and/or incorrect documents submitted during registration.
4. Clubs and players who are proven to have violated the rules by playing unauthorized players will be subject to sanctions as regulated in the PSSI Disciplinary Code.
5. Clubs can play all foreign players who have registered and received approval in the Match according to paragraphs (6) and (10), letter d of Article 44.
6. Every player approved by the I.League will receive an ID card. If the ID card is lost, damaged, or assigned to another party, the club will be fine IDR 5,000,000 (five million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 11

### PLAYER REGISTRATION PERIOD

There are two periods for player registration in the BRI Super League. I.League will provide written notification to the Clubs at the time of each registration period. The period shall be divided into:

- a. Registration period 1 starts from July 8, 2025, to August 30, 2025;
- b. Registration period 2 starts from January 10, 2026, to February 6, 2026.

## ARTICLE 12

### PLAYER REGISTRATION

1. The club must register a minimum of 18 (eighteen) players and a maximum of 35 (thirty-five) players, with the following provisions:
  - a. a maximum of 30 (thirty) players of any age;
  - b. a minimum of 5 (five) U-23 players (born on or after January 1, 2003).
2. Clubs are allowed to register a maximum of 11 (eleven) foreign players (non-Indonesian citizens).
3. Clubs are required to register at least three goalkeepers. For Clubs that do not meet this requirement, I.League has the authority to refuse to validate the registration of their players.
4. Clubs may field players from the EPA team in the BRI Super League main team at any time, as long as it has been approved in the SIAP without reducing the 35 (thirty-five) player quota. Those eligible to become EPA players must be born on or after January 1, 2006.
5. Clubs are permitted to propose registered Officials as Players while still complying with the provisions specified in this Article.
6. Players must wear their registered name and jersey number during the BRI Super League. Changes to the number and name may only be made if a player transfers to a new Club with the approval of the I.League.
7. Clubs are permitted to cancel a player's registration by submitting a player withdrawal form to LIAS. Such withdrawal still requires I.League approval.
8. Clubs can generally add players to their squads within the limits of established quotas only during the Player registration period as specified in Article 11, letters a and b.

## ARTICLE 13

### PLAYER REGISTRATION DOCUMENT

1. Players who will be registered in LIAS online are those who have obtained approval from PSSI through SIAP.
2. Players registered in LIAS are required to complete the following biodata and documents:
  - a. name on back of jersey;
  - b. number on back of jersey;
  - c. position;
  - d. contact number;
  - e. insurance (at least BPJS Employment);
  - f. Pre-Competition Medical Assessment (PCMA);
  - g. a recent half-body photo of the Player wearing the First Uniform with a plain white background, JPEG format, high-resolution or full HD quality (resolution 1500 x 2102 / 5R / 3.8 MB), according to the technical provisions in the Manual;
  - h. Limited Stay Permit (KITAS), specifically for foreign players.
3. Clubs are responsible for all administrative matters related to Player registration documents as stipulated in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article.
4. I.League has the authority to require Clubs, Players, and/or Agents to present original documents for verification, which will be returned after the verification process is complete.

## ARTICLE 14

### PLAYER STATUS

1. All players' status matters are governed by rules set out in the Status and Transfer of Players (RSTP) and the PSSI Player Regulations.
2. A player can only be under contract with, registered to, and eligible to play for 1 (one) Club at a time during the BRI Super League. Clubs are required to ensure that their players are not under contract or registered with another club.
3. A player can be registered with a maximum of 3 (three) Clubs during 1 (one) competition season and play for a maximum of 2 (two) Clubs in official matches. This is regulated in the RSTP.

4. A player violating paragraph (2) of this Article will be reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee with the potential sanction of a ban from playing for at least 1 (one) subsequent Super League competition season, unless the Player can provide valid evidence of his innocence. Based on an investigation conducted by the I.League, if the Player's Club is proven to violate its obligations under paragraph (3) of this Article, the consequences may be as follows:
  - a. The Club is declared to have lost by 0-3 in any Match in which the offending player played. However, if the goal difference at the end of the Match is higher than 0-3, that result will prevail;
  - b. The Club of the offending player is reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee for additional sanctions according to the PSSI Disciplinary Code.
5. PSSI has the authority to verify player registration documents according to paragraph (1) of this article. If these documents are incomplete, the player will not be approved by PSSI and will be prohibited from playing.
6. Players can be transferred under the following conditions:
  - a. A player under a contract can transfer to another Club in Indonesia through a player transfer mechanism (with agreed contract termination compensation) or loan, according to the PSSI Player Regulations, without conflicting with paragraph (2) of this Article;
  - b. Clubs that add players through transfer or loan mechanisms must submit a request to add players through SIAP.
7. All matters related to contract termination and subsequent actions are regulated in the PSSI Player Regulations.

## ARTICLE 15

### LOAN PLAYER

1. Players may be loaned for a predetermined period by the former Club to another Club on the basis of a written agreement. The following rules apply to a Player loan:
  - a. the Clubs shall conclude a written agreement defining the terms of the loan (a "loan agreement"). The player may also be a party to the loan agreement;
  - b. the player and the new Club shall sign a contract covering the duration, value of the contract, and the player's status as a loan player;
  - c. during the agreed duration of the loan, the contractual obligations between the Player and the former Club shall be suspended unless otherwise agreed in writing;

- d. the loan agreement is valid for a minimum of 2 (two) predetermined registration periods, as stipulated in Article 11, with a maximum duration of 1 year. The end date shall fall within one of the registration periods of the former Club;
    - e. the loan agreement may be extended, subject to the minimum and maximum terms as specified in paragraph (1), letter d of this Article, with the written consent of the Player;
    - f. the new Club (the loan Club) is prohibited from sub-loaning or permanently transferring a Player to a third Club.
2. Loan agreement with a duration of more than 1 year before this provision comes into effect, the loan agreement must be renewed according to paragraph (1), letter e of this Article.
3. If the loan agreement between a Player and a new Club has been unilaterally terminated prior to the completion of the duration agreed in the loan agreement:
  - a. The Player has the right to return to the former Club;
  - b. The Player must immediately inform the former Club of premature termination and decide whether they intend to return to the former Club;
  - c. If the Player decides to return to the former Club, the former Club must re-register the player immediately through the SIAP application. The loan status will be changed once the Player is successfully registered.
  - d. The return of the loan Player is stipulated in paragraph (1), letter d of this Article.
4. A Club may have a maximum of 6 (six) loan players at any given time during 1 (one) season.

## ARTICLE 16

### PLAYER CONTRACT

1. PSSI determines a standard player contract by referring to RSTP, PSSI Player Regulations, NDRC Regulations, and FIFA circulars regarding Standard Contract Requirements.
2. Regarding the Player's contract and its protection, the date on which the Player is registered with the Club is subject to the following provisions:
  - a. For a Player undergoing an international transfers, the effective date shall be the date of the International Transfer Certificate (ITC) issuance as stipulated in Article 17;
  - b. For a Player undergoing a domestic transfers, the effective date shall be the date of the contract's signing as stipulated in Article 11.

3. Clubs are required to comply with the terms of the standard player contract and are allowed to make adjustments as agreed between the Clubs and the Players. These adjustments must be submitted to PSSI for verification and approval.
4. PSSI has the authority to verify every player's registration contract and may order changes if any clauses are detrimental to either party. The player's approval will be suspended until these conditions are met.
5. Clubs are prohibited from playing players whose contracts have officially expired. Clubs are required to extend their contracts 30 days before the end of the contract period, and then submit the extension to SIAP and LIAS.

## ARTICLE 17

### TRANSFER MATCHING SYSTEM (TMS)

1. For international transfers of players and the issuance of International Transfer Certificates (ITCs), the mechanism of using FIFA's Transfer Matching System (TMS) shall apply, as regulated in RSTP.
2. Every club engaging in international transfers of players are required to follow the mechanism of Transfer Matching System (TMS).
3. PSSI administers the player transfer mechanism for players wishing to play in Indonesia, which is conducted through the Transfer Matching System (TMS).
  - a. Period 1 starts from June 24, 2025, to September 11, 2025;
  - b. Period 2 starts from January 10, 2026, to February 6, 2026.

## ARTICLE 18

### STRATA AND VERIFICATION OF FOREIGN PLAYERS

1. Foreign players who have played outside Indonesia in the previous season must adhere to the competition strata criteria of their former club, as specified in the PSSI circular.
2. Foreign players playing for the first time in the BRI Super League with citizenship and coming from countries in the clearance house (CH) category are allowed to play in the BRI Super League, based on the provisions of the Directorate General of Immigration of the Republic of Indonesia, and must meet the requirements specified in the legislation and PSSI Player Regulations.

3. If a foreign player whose contract has expired and/or has been terminated as agreed with the Club, and the Player does not move to another Club in the ongoing BRI Super League, the Club is required to immediately process an Exit Permit Only (EPO) and coordinate with the Agent of the foreign Player.
4. Foreign players who have played in a competition outside of Indonesia during the previous season are required to follow the verification process established by the PSSI.
5. Verification requests for foreign players can only be made by the Club and/or Agent.
6. Clubs are required to understand the provisions in this Article before signing an employment contract with a Player and registering the Player with PSSI and I.League.

## ARTICLE 19

### OFFICIALS

1. Every Club can register an Official during the BRI Super League period via LIAS online, which has been approved by PSSI via the SIAP application.
2. Every Club can register a maximum of 20 (twenty) Officials who have previously received approval from PSSI through SIAP.
3. Every Club is required to register Officials holding the following positions:
  - a. manager;
  - b. head coach;
  - c. assistant coach;
  - d. goalkeeper coach;
  - e. media officer team;
  - f. team doctor;
  - g. security officer.
4. The Official's title and responsibilities as stated in their employment contract must be consistent with what is officially registered with LIAS. Violations of this paragraph will be subject to a fine of IDR 20,000,000 (twenty million rupiah).
5. Each Club can only register 11 (eleven) Officials to be listed on the Official Determination Form via the Match Form, who are allowed to sit on the team bench during the Match.

6. Of the 11 (eleven) Officials who are allowed to sit on the team bench, 2 (two) of them with the following positions are obliged to be on the team bench in every Match:

- a. head coach;
- b. team doctor;

along with 9 (nine) other officials with one of the following positions:

- c. team manager;
- d. assistant manager;
- e. assistant coach;
- f. goalkeeper coach;
- g. physical trainer;
- h. interpreter;
- i. technical director;
- j. team media officer;
- k. physiotherapist;
- l. kit man;and
- m. other positions deemed necessary by the team.

7. If a Club registers fewer than 11 (eleven) Officials or the I.League does not duly approve the registered Officials, the number of Officials permitted to sit on the team bench shall be reduced proportionally.

8. Officials who have been registered but have not received approval are not permitted to sit on the bench. Violations of this paragraph are subject to a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million rupiah).

9. Every Official officially approved by the I.League will receive accreditation in the form of an ID card. If the ID card is lost, damaged, or assigned to another party, the Club will be subject to a fine of IDR 5,000,000 (five million rupiah).

10. Once the Official has been approved, the club can still replace the Official at any time. Official registration must be completed no later than two days before the next match, as specified in the applicable registration regulations. New official may participate after receiving an ID card issued by the I.League.

11. A club transferring officials is required to provide written notification to the I.League no later than seven days after the transfer. Violating this rule will result in a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million rupiah).

12. To the approval the new official, the Club must return their ID cards to I.League no later than three days after submitting the notification letter. I.League will not issue new Official ID Cards before receiving the deleted Official ID Cards.

13. A club replacing a head coach is required to provide written notification to PSSI and the I.League no later than three days before the contract termination. The club shall register a new head coach no later than 30 days after submitting the notification letter and shall ensure the replacement fulfills the qualifications as stipulated in Article 20 of these Regulations.
14. Violation of paragraph (13) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah). If the Club does not register a new head coach within the second 30 days, it will be subject to an additional fine of Rp. 200,000,000 (two hundred million rupiah) with the fine increasing in multiples.

## ARTICLE 20

### OFFICIAL REGISTRATION DOCUMENT

1. Officials who will be registered in LIAS online are those who have received approval from PSSI through SIAP.
2. Officials registered in SIAP and LIAS are required to complete the following biodata and documents:
  - a. original copy of the Resident Identity Card (for local officials) with a validity period as stipulated by Indonesian law;
  - b. original colored copy of passport (for foreign officials) with a minimum validity period of 18 months;
  - c. original copy of the employment contract between the Club and the Official;
  - d. supporting documents for qualifications or work status according to the position, which are further stipulated in Appendix 7 of this Regulation;
  - e. a recent half-body photo of an Official wearing the official Club uniform, in a white background, PNG format, and high resolution (1500 x 2102 / 5R / 3.8 MB). The photo must not include hats, sunglasses, and/or other attributes that indicate the identity of a community organization;
  - f. foreign officials must attach an original copy of their Limited Stay Permit (KITAS) with a validity period tied to the purpose of the upcoming or ongoing competition season. If the Official was registered by another club in the previous competition season, the club cannot attach the KITAS used, even if it is still valid.
3. Clubs are responsible for all administrative matters related to Official documents.
4. In certain cases, the I.League has the authority to request original Club and/or Official documents, which will be returned after verification.

## ARTICLE 21

### PLAYER AND OFFICIAL APPROVAL

1. Players and Officials who have fulfilled all the requirements will be approved by the I.League.
2. I.League has the authority to suspend or revoke the approval of Players and/or Officials if violations are found regarding matters regulated and determined by I.League based on Regulations or other provisions related to the BRI Super League.

## IV. ACCREDITATION

### ARTICLE 22

#### ACCREDITATION

1. All personnel involved in the BRI Super League are required to wear an accreditation in the form of an ID card at all times, especially during the Match.
2. I.League will publish accreditation formats and prepare designs for ID cards as stipulated in paragraph (1) of this Article, production and distribution of accreditation, except for Players and Officials.
3. Clubs are required to ensure that the ID cards provided by the I.League are only for registered and authorized players and officials. Those without official accreditation will not be permitted to enter the stadium.
4. The ID cards issued by the I.League do not grant access to all areas of the stadium. The I.League will issue supplementary access devices (SADs) that provide limited entry access to the official area (OA) and the FOP area as specified in the Manual.
5. Clubs are required to ensure that Players and Officials who are banned from playing and/or not registered on the E-startlist and/or Officials list are prohibited from using SAD or entering the official area (OA) and FOP Area during the ban period.
6. Violations of this Article will be subject to a minimum fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million rupiah).
7. ID cards issued by I.League, as regulated in paragraph (2) of this article, can be printed via the link: <https://lias.ileague.id/clubdashboard>.

## V. MATCH SCHEDULE AND STATUS

### ARTICLE 23

#### MATCH SCHEDULE

1. All matches are played according to the match schedule set by the I.League.
2. The BRI Super League Match Schedule, including kick-off times for Matches broadcast live by the host broadcaster, is fully determined by I.League.
3. The kick-off times are 3:30 PM, 7:00 PM, and 8:30 PM (during Ramadan). To avoid any confusion regarding kick-off times, the Club and Match Officials refer to the synchronization of Western Indonesian Time using the GMT+7/UTC+7.
4. Unless otherwise specified, the Match Schedule and kick-off times on the final Matchday of BRI Super League shall be held simultaneously. The I.League has the authority to determine the Match Schedule and kick-off times.
5. I.League holds the authority to change the Match Schedule at any time. Prior to deciding on such changes, the I.League shall coordinate with the Clubs involved and/or affected by such changes to the Match Schedule.
6. I.League may make changes to the Match Schedule no later than 5 days before the Match for the following reasons:
  - a. KAMTIBMAS POLRI, Public Security and Order (KAMTIBMAS), which operates under the Indonesian National Police (POLRI);
  - b. to adjust to a live television broadcast schedule;
  - c. a predetermined Match Schedule clashes with an international football agenda;
  - d. a predetermined Match Schedule clashes with a national/regional agenda;
  - e. the condition of the Field of Play and/or stadium is unsuitable for holding a Match;
  - f. Especially in Force Majeure conditions, I.League can make changes to the Match Schedule at any time.
7. The host club may submit a request to change the Match Schedule if police authorization is not obtained, provided that such request is submitted no later than 7 days prior to the match, the request shall subsequently be subject to approval or rejection by the I.League.
8. If the Club requests a change of schedule outside the deadline stipulated in paragraph (6) of this Article, and the request is rejected by the I.League, then the I.League shall designate the Match to be held at a neutral venue with all the associated costs borne by the host Club.

## ARTICLE 24

### MATCH

1. All Matches are played according to the LOTG, which is established and maintained by the International Football Association Board (IFAB) and published by FIFA.
2. All Matches are attended by spectators based on the recommendation of security authorities in the local Match area.
3. The match can only start if both Clubs have a minimum of 7 (seven) Players ready on the Field of Play, including the goalkeeper. The Match shall not commence or continue if either Club has fewer than 7 (seven) Players on the Field Of Play.

## ARTICLE 25

### MATCH DURATION

1. The match shall last for a period of 90 minutes, which is divided into 2 (two) equal halves of 45 minutes each (standard time). The Match shall commence at the scheduled time, unless otherwise stated in the official match countdown issued by the match commissioner for each match. Players from both teams shall enter the pitch with the Match Officials (Match ceremonial procession) no later than 5 minutes prior to kick-off.
2. The 15-minute halftime interval is calculated from the final whistle of the first half to the beginning of the second half. By the 12th minute of the halftime interval, both teams shall leave the locker rooms to prepare for the commencement of the second half of the Match.
3. Negligence of any party resulting in a delay in the start of the Match (delayed kick-off) of the first half and/or a delayed kick-off of the second half for more than 90 seconds caused by:
  - a. delayed kick-off caused by Club negligence;
  - b. delayed kick-off caused by the Local Organizing Committee;
  - c. delayed kick-off caused by external parties,will be subject to a fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah).

If an external party causes the delayed kick-off, sanctions will apply to affiliated parties, including but not limited to the Local Organizing Committee.

If the delayed kick-off is caused by natural conditions, weather, or unforeseen circumstances, there are no sanctions for any party.
4. To avoid any doubt regarding kick-off time, Clubs and Match Officials must refer to the synchronization of Western Indonesian Time based on GMT+7/UTC+7 as designated by the I.League.

## ARTICLE 26

### MATCH POSTPONEMENT OR CANCELLATION

1. If a Match cannot start on time due to force majeure or other reasons, including but not limited to an unplayable Field of Play, bad weather, or stadium light failure, the following procedures will apply:
  - a. the referee decides that the Match is postponed for at least 30 minutes. During this postponement, the referee may decide whether the match can be restarted before the end of the postponement period;
  - b. after the initial 30-minute delay (as specified in paragraph (1), letter a of this Article), a second 30-minute delay can be added if necessary. If the referee determines that the second delay allows for continuation, the match can either resume or be cancelled. Within the period of the second delay, the referee may decide that the Match can start before the end of the delay.
  - c. when the second 30-minute delay period ends, the Field of Play and other facilities can be reused, and the Match can proceed based on a decision agreed upon by both Clubs, Match Officials, and security personnel;
  - d. when the second 30-minute delay period ends, and the referee determines that the Match cannot continue, the referee will declare the Match cancelled.
2. According to Article 2, paragraph (5), the Match Decision Authority must make a final decision within 2 hours of the referee's cancellation by considering all aspects related to the status of the Match. Any indication of disciplinary violations due to the cancellation of the match will be reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
3. The decision made by the Match Decision Authority, According to Article 26 paragraph (2), is final and cannot be appealed.

## ARTICLE 27

### CLUB ABSENCE AT THE CITY

If the Match is forfeited because a Club fails to appear at the city as previously scheduled for reasons other than Force Majeure or other factors that have been determined in the Regulations, then the following procedure applies:

1. If the Organizing Committee does not receive information and/or certainty regarding the arrival of one of the participating Clubs at least 3 hours before kick-off, the match commissioner will hold an emergency meeting attended by the head of the Organizing Committee, security officers, medical officers, media officers, police, the Clubs that have attended, and refereeing officials to discuss the absence of one of the Clubs in the city where the Match is scheduled to take place, according to the schedule set by I.League. The Match Ceremony will no longer need to be held due to the absence of one of the Clubs.

2. The match commissioner must confirm to the I.League at least 2 hours before kick-off regarding the absence of one of the Clubs on the scheduled city, and make a report to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
3. Violations of this Article, the I.League can immediately determine the status of the match, and the absent Club must be subject to sanctions by being declared to have lost the match by a score of 0-3 and must be reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee for additional sanctions.

## ARTICLE 28

### CLUB ABSENCE AT THE VENUE

If the Match is forfeited because a Club fails to appear at the Match venue as previously scheduled for reasons other than Force Majeure or other factors that have been determined in the Regulations, then the following procedure applies:

1. Within 90 minutes prior to kick-off, the match commissioner is responsible for ensuring that all match preparations are complete, including the presence of match officials and at least one of the clubs at the stadium.
2. Within 50 minutes to 20 minutes prior to the kick-off, Clubs and referees are allowed to warm up.
3. No later than 20 minutes prior to kick-off, the Organizing Committee shall have received definitive confirmation about the absence of either Club at the venue by the specified time.
4. The referee informs the team captains, Club Officials, and the match commissioner that one of the Clubs is not present at kick-off time.
5. The match commissioner informs the I.League of the Club's absence and makes a special report to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
6. Violations of this Article, the I.League can immediately determine the status of the match, and the absent Club will be subject to sanctions by being declared a 0-3 loser and reported to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee for additional sanctions.

## ARTICLE 29

### MATCH SUSPENSION

1. If the match is stopped prior to the standard duration of the Match ends due to Force Majeure or other reasons, such as an unplayable Field of Play, bad weather, stadium light failure, crowd disturbances, or other factors that hinder the progress of the match, then the following procedures apply:
  - a. the Match is stopped for 30 minutes. Within the stoppage time, the referee may decide to continue the match before the 30 minutes are fully up;
  - b. after the initial 30-minute stoppage (as stipulated in paragraph (1), letter a of this Article), an additional 30 minutes of stoppage time can be added. If the referee determines that the second stoppage time is possible to continue, the Match will resume; otherwise, it will be declared stopped. During this stoppage time, the referee may decide that the Match can be started before the time ends;
  - c. after the second 30-minute stoppage has ended, the Field of Play and other facilities may be reused, and the Match can proceed based on a decision agreed upon by both Clubs, Match Officials, and security personnel;
  - d. after the second 30-minute stoppage has ended and the referee determines that the Match is still not possible, the referee will declare the Match postponed. The match commissioner must then immediately submit a written report to the I.League regarding this decision;
2. In emergency/extraordinary circumstances, prioritizing safety & security, the match commissioner and/or I.League can immediately make a decision by ignoring the stages specified in paragraph (1), letters a & b of this Article.
3. No later than 2 hours after the referee's decision to postpone the Match (as stipulated in paragraph (1), letter d and paragraph (2) of this Article), the I.League must decide on the status of the Match based on the report from the match commissioner. By considering all aspects, the I.League must determine whether to reschedule the match and ensure its completion, or make other decisions. The I.League's decision is final and cannot be appealed.
4. According to paragraph (3) of this Article, if the I.League decides to reschedule and continue the postponed Match until it is complete, then the following matters will apply:
  - a. The match shall resume with the same result as at the last minute when the Match was stopped. If the Match is stopped during normal time is running, the Match shall resume by means of a dropped ball at the last position of the ball when the Match was stopped, as stipulated in paragraph (1), letters a, b, and c of this Article;
  - b. The match shall resume with the same players, including those on the pitch and on the bench;

- c. The clubs involved shall not allowed to add or change the composition of the registered substitute players when the Match is stopped/postponed;
  - d. The number of player substitutions must correspond to the conditions at the time the Match was stopped/postponed;
  - e. Players who receive a red card in a stopped/postponed Match cannot be replaced by another player;
  - f. All cards awarded before the Match is stopped/postponed remain valid for the remaining time of the resumed Match;
  - g. The kick-off time, date, and venue of the rescheduled Match are decided by the Match Decision Authority.
5. If a Match is set to proceed and is played in the interval between the following Match Schedule of one of the Clubs playing in the postponed Match, all disciplinary sanctions related to yellow cards received in the postponed Match are suspended. Meanwhile, disciplinary sanctions resulting from red cards remain valid.
6. Based on paragraph (3) of this Article, if the Match is determined to be complete and the results of the match are validated by the I.League, all records of goals scored and yellow cards are declared to remain valid.
7. Based on paragraph (1) of this Article, if the Match is declared finished by the referee, without carrying out the procedures in paragraph (1), letters a to d, the match commissioner will immediately submit a report to the I.League to then decide on the status of the Match, no later than 2 hours after the Match was stopped.
8. If one of the Clubs has fewer than 7 (seven) Players, the Match must be stopped and the opposing Club is declared the winner with a score of 3-0, or if at the time the Match is stopped the Club with the fewer Players loses by a greater goal difference, this result must be the final result. All records of goal scorers and yellow cards remain valid.

## ARTICLE 30

### MATCH SUSPENSION DUE TO THE CLUB'S REFUSAL TO PLAY

1. In the event that the Match is stopped by the referee before the end of the normal duration of the Match because of the Club's refusal to continue the Match or leaving the Field of Play before the match is complete, the Match is declared finished. I.League shall then declare and decide the opposing club wins 3-0, or if at the time the match was stopped, the club was losing by a greater goal difference, this result will apply as the final result.
2. The referee has 5 minutes to decide to abandon the Match if a Club refuses to continue playing.
3. The PSSI Disciplinary Committee may impose additional sanctions according to the PSSI Disciplinary Code and other provisions binding on the Club causing the Match to be suspended, based on this Article.
4. All goal and yellow card records remain valid.

## VI. VIDEO ASSISTANT REFEREE (VAR)

### ARTICLE 31

#### VIDEO ASSISTANT REFEREE (VAR)

1. PSSI determines the use of VAR technology in all BRI Super League matches by considering the provisions in the LOTG, VAR Handbook, and other provisions issued by FIFA, IFAB, AFC, PSSI, and/or I.League.
2. The referee on duty in the VOR is tasked with assisting the referee on the pitch in making decisions using recorded replays, according to the applicable provisions.
3. The VAR referee can only intervene in 4 (four) incidents on the pitch, called the VAR protocol, namely:
  - a. Goal/ no goal,
  - b. Penalty/no penalty,
  - c. Direct red card, and
  - d. Mistaken identity.
4. VAR Advice Only (without OFR) is used for factual and objective incidents, where on-field referee interpretation is not required. OFR is necessary for subjective incidents that require referee interpretation.
5. The Match is still declared valid and cannot be abandoned or repeated for the following reasons:
  - a. There is a technical problem or issue with the VAR device, which results in a reduction in the VAR Device features and/or the VAR Device not functioning.
  - b. There is a potential problem with the power source used by the VAR device, resulting in a safety concern if the VAR device remains switched on and operated.
  - c. There is a mistaken referee decision, even though it involves the use of VAR, considering that VAR is part of the Match Officials.
  - d. The referee's decision not to conduct an OFR review of an incident.
  - e. VAR observes incidents that do not actually fall into the category of reviewable incidents according to the VAR protocol.
6. Any player or team official who enters the RRA during the OFR process may be subject to a yellow card sanction.
7. Any player or team official who repeatedly protests to the referee with a gesture resembling the monitor symbol as a request for a VAR check may be subject to a yellow card sanction.

8. Any player or team official who intentionally enters the VOR Room is deemed to have committed a serious violation of match discipline and may be subject to a direct red card sanction.
9. Violations of this article are considered serious violations of discipline and can be subject to a maximum fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 32

### THE USE OF VAR EQUIPMENT DURING A MATCH

1. The host club is responsible for maintaining the security of the VAR equipment used during the match. Barricades and special guarding by stewards are necessary, both for the VAR equipment located inside the stadium and in the van (truck). Access and mobilization of match equipment to and from the referee's room must also be strictly guarded. The host club is also responsible for the VAR equipment when it is not in use.
2. If the VAR device is used by the I.League or for another Club's Match and/or for a Match at another venue for Match purposes outside the previous Club's responsibility, all responsibility for the security, storage, and condition of the device is fully assigned to the host Club that next uses the VAR device, starting from the date and time of handover until the device is returned to the I.League or the Club that previously stored the device. The Club must attach a VAR device handover form signed by representatives of both parties and acknowledged by the I.League, accompanied by visual documentation (photos and/or videos) as evidence of the condition of the VAR device at the time of handover and return.
3. Unauthorized parties are prohibited from entering the VOR. Only Match Officials, PSSI, and/or I.League personnel on duty, and other parties specifically assigned to support the operation of the VAR equipment, are permitted. Club officials and players are also prohibited from entering the VOR.
4. The host club is required to ensure the Field of Play is in good condition for the match. The pitch lines must be clearly visible and thick, and the dimensions must comply with applicable regulations. This is essential for the calibration and synchronization process of the VAR device. If necessary, the Match Officials or match commissioner can request the Organizing Committee to thicken the pitch lines.

5. The host club is required to provide the primary power source from an electric generator (generator) for the operation of the VAR device on D-1 Match and the Day of the Match (starting 5 hours before kickoff until 3 hours after full-time). The generator must meet the minimum requirement of 20 (twenty) KVA single phase (1 pass). In other conditions, stadium electricity (PLN) can be used for the operation of the VAR device if the power source is only dedicated to the VAR device (separate from the power source used for the Stadium lights and/or Perimeter LED and/or giant screen and others).
6. The power source used for VAR devices must be stable (no surges or shocks in voltage and electric current) and must not have the potential for overvoltage or power loss.
7. Violations of this Article are considered serious violations of Competition discipline and may be subject to a minimum fine of IDR 250,000,000 (two hundred and fifty million rupiah).

## VII. STADIUM AND TRAINING PITCH

### ARTICLE 33

#### STADIUM

1. The stadium to be used by the Club must be nominated and written in the Stadium designation form.
2. Clubs must register and submit the results of the stadium risk assessment/re-risk assessment conducted by DITPAMOBVIT POLRI to I.League.
3. All stadiums must adhere to the 2021 edition of the PSSI Stadium Regulations and the standardization results set by PSSI, and obtain approval from PSSI for use in the BRI Super League.
4. Nominated stadiums must have a lighting system capable of reaching an average horizontal field illumination of 1,600 lux and guarantee a power source. Stadiums must provide a generator capable of accommodating backup power needs.
5. PSSI and/or I.League have the right to reject the Stadium nomination submitted by the Club and ask the Club to play the Match at another Stadium in the same city or area, near the city or area where the Club is located, or a neutral venue.
6. During the BRI Super League, Clubs must play Matches at Stadiums that have been approved by PSSI and/or I.League.
7. I.League has inspection authority at any time, before and during the BRI Super League, to ensure the condition of the Stadium meets the specified criteria, such as the Field of Play, Stadium lights, room facilities, and media areas.
8. According to paragraph (7) of this Article, if the condition of the Stadium does not meet the specified criteria, the host Club is obliged to nominate an alternative Stadium for the next home match no later than 2 days after receiving an official letter from the I.League.
9. The host club is required to provide internet access in the stadium area according to the specified criteria, including but not limited to the media center area, media stands, TV production room (HB), match commissioner room, match commissioner work area, and VOR, minimum two days before the Match. Further provisions regarding internet access in the stadium area are specified in Appendix 6 of these Regulations.

10. During the trial period for implementing safeguards related to FIFA Campaigns & marketing regulations regarding smoke-free stands, Local Organizing Committee is required to provide a special smoking area.
11. Local Organizing Committee is required to accommodate lighting during the competition. Violations of this article that result in a match suspension of more than one hour will be subject to a fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 34

### FIELD OF PLAY

1. The host club shall ensure that the field of play is in good condition and fully compliant for the staging of the Match.
2. The field of play may not be used for activities and events other than official training for 48 hours before kick-off, unless there is another BRI Super League Match or other competition organized by PSSI and/or I.League.
3. The field of play for the BRI Super League must use natural or hybrid grass, with a higher percentage of natural grass than synthetic. Pitches that use only synthetic grass are not permitted.
4. The surface of the field of play must be level, and the grass height of the pitch must generally not exceed 30 mm. If necessary, the referee or match commissioner may request the Local Organizing Committee to reduce the height of the grass used for official matches and training at the stadium.
5. The field of play may use light reflection techniques, provided the grass remains at the same height throughout the pitch. Thickness-and-thin techniques that result in varying grass heights, including circles and diagonal patterns, are not permitted on Field of Plays.
6. The match commissioner may decide on whether to water the pitch: 1 hour before official training, 3 hours and/or 1 hour, and/or 20 minutes before kick-off.
7. If the I.League determines that the Field of Play is not suitable for use because the pitch is used for activities other than the Match, and there are permit issues, the I.League will immediately notify the Club officially, no later than 5 days before the Match.
8. The match commissioner is required to inspect the stadium two days before the Match and ensure all aspects comply with the LOTG. If the condition of the field of play, including the goal and pitch dimensions, does not meet the LOTG, the match commissioner will instruct the Local Organizing Committee to make repairs or replacements.

9. If there is any doubt regarding the condition of the field of play before the Match, the referee will decide whether the pitch can be used or not. If the referee determines that the Match cannot start according to the schedule, the provisions as set out in Article 26 will apply.

## ARTICLE 35

### OFFICIAL TRAINING AT THE STADIUM

1. Both participating Clubs is permitted to conduct official training on the day before the Match at the stadium where the match will be held, while taking into account weather and pitch conditions. Training time must not exceed 1 hour and can be conducted at the same time as the kick-off time. Away club has priority in time selection or another agreed time.
2. If there is a BRI Super League Match on the day when the Club will conduct official training at the Stadium, the Club can conduct official training at the Stadium in the morning, no later than 10.00 a.m. local time.
3. The host club is required to provide a stadium for official training sessions at the time specified by the away club. Away club is required to submit an official training schedule at the stadium to the host club no later than three days before the official training session. If the away club does not submit an official training schedule at the stadium as specified in this paragraph, the official training schedule will be determined by the host club.
4. The time gap between the team that has finished and the one that will conduct official training at the Stadium is at least 15 minutes.
5. The field of play must be prepared in the same condition as in the official training session.
6. If the field of play is not in good condition, no later than two days before the Match, the match commissioner may cancel the official training session at the stadium. Both Clubs will only be permitted to inspect and familiarize themselves with the stadium in jogging shoes. The official training session will be moved to another pitch approved by the I.League and must be prepared by the host club.
7. If both Clubs and one of the Clubs chooses not to conduct official training at the Stadium, that Club must notify the match commissioner about the time of official training at the training pitch approved by the I.League. This training will be considered official training as stipulated in paragraph (1) of this Article.
8. Players who are banned from playing and are listed on the list of banned players (NLB) within a specific period are permitted to take part in official training.

9. Match officials are permitted to practice at the stadium where the Match will take place on the day before the Match, at a time different from the practice times of both participating Clubs.
10. The host Club is obliged to provide locker rooms for the Club at the stadium, along with 1 (one) ambulance unit and paramedics during official training sessions.
11. Violations of this Article will be subject to a sanction of IDR 20,000,000 (twenty million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 36

### TRAINING PITCH

1. The host Club can provide recommendations or information regarding the needs of the visiting club if they want to rent a pitch to hold training outside of the official training sessions at the stadium.
2. The cost incurred from training pitch rental is borne by the respective Clubs. Local transportation is provided by the host club only if training takes place on D-2, D-1, or Match day.

## VIII. LOGISTICS

### ARTICLE 37

#### LOGISTICS PROVISIONS

1. The host club is responsible for covering all expenses related to hosting the BRI Super League Match.

Every Club must arrive in the city where the Match will take place no later than 2 days before the Match.

- a. If the Club arrives in the city where the Match is held on D-1 or the exact day of the Match, the Club is obliged to provide written notification to the I.League and provide a clear reason;
  - b. Late arrival of the away club will not affect the implementation of official Match activities (e.g., match coordination meeting, press conference).
2. During the BRI Super League, each Club is responsible for accommodation costs in the city where the Match takes place, starting from the day of arrival until the day of departure.
  3. Clubs are not allowed to stay in the same hotel as Match Officials.
  4. The host club is required to provide local transportation for the away Club, starting from D-2 of the Match until D+1 of the Match, with the following specifications:
    - a. 1 (one) unit bus with a capacity of 40 (forty) people, has AC facilities, used for pick-up and return (arrival and departure) as well as other official activities related to the Match;
    - b. 1 (one) unit minibus, starting from H-2 to H+1 of the Match;
    - c. 1 (one) unit of box car for team equipment when the team arrives, returns, and other times related to Official Training and/or Matches if necessary;
    - d. matters outside those stipulated in this paragraph, additional costs are the responsibility of the Club.
  5. Clubs will be picked up at the airport or train station in the city where the Match takes place. If there is no airport or train station in the city, they will be picked up at the airport or train station closest to the city.
  6. Local accommodation of Match Officials is covered by I.League.
  7. Transportation from the city of origin to the Match city for Match Officials is covered by I.League.

8. Clubs are required to have commercial asset storage space (Marketing Collateral) as regulated in marketing regulations.
9. Violations of paragraphs (4) and (5) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 38

### MATCH BALL

1. Every match must use the official BRI Super League ball.
2. Official balls will be provided by I.League and distributed to each participating Club with a total of 15 (fifteen) balls for each Club before the BRI Super League starts, and 15 (fifteen) additional balls before the second round of the BRI Super League starts.
3. Each Club is required to use the official BRI Super League balls for official training during Matches.
4. Each host club is provided with 10 (ten) match balls by the I.League. The host club is obliged to maintain the official balls provided by the I.League in good condition. Adding writing, markings, drawings, or scribbling on the balls used in matches is prohibited.
5. Each Club is prohibited from using balls other than official balls during official training sessions and pre-match warm-ups at the Stadium.
6. Violations of this Article are subject to a fine of IDR 25,000,000 (twenty-five million rupiah).

## IX. EQUIPMENT

### ARTICLE 39

#### CLUB JERSEY COLORS AND EQUIPMENT

1. The use of Jersey colors in BRI Super League must follow the provisions as regulated in the LOTG and the Letter of Conditions for the Use of Match Jersey published by I.League.
2. Each Club must submit form D (Jersey color) into the I.League system via <https://lias.ileague.id/clubdashboard> no later than June 20, 2025 for approval.
3. The first, second and third Jersey colors of each Club must be different colors, including using derivative colors and using light and dark color elements (for example: if light blue has been used in the first Uniform, it is not allowed to use dark blue in the second and third Jersey). In this case, the numbers and names on the backs of the Player and Goalkeeper Jersey must be contrasting and clearly visible.
4. Every Club must own and register the following team equipment:
  - a. First, second and third Jersey to be used by Players and goalkeepers in a Match;
  - b. Goalkeeper Jersey without numbers for the first, second and third Jersey;
  - c. Officials' Kits;
  - d. Vests (*bibs*).
5. The first, second and third Jersey registered in accordance with paragraph (4) of this Article including examples thereof must have:
  - a. Player's number and name;
  - b. placement of promotional material belonging to Club sponsors;
  - c. number Player must be attached to the back and front left side of the Player's pants.
6. The first, second and third Jersey registered as set out in paragraph (4) And (5) of this Article must be used during the BRI Super League, and any changes must be submitted in writing to I.League for approval.

7. Clubs may have and register the fourth Jersey in addition to the home and away Jersey.
8. The color and type of Jersey used by the goalkeeper in a Match must be different from the color used by other Players.
9. I.League may approve and decide on the size, type and color of equipment.
10. All equipment used by Clubs in BRI Super League must be authorized and approved by I.League. Clubs are prohibited from playing using equipment that has not been authorized by I.League.
11. Each Official listed on the Match form must wear a contrasting color to the color of the participating Players' Jersey and the Referee's Kit.
12. Each captain of each Club must wear a special mark (armband) indicating his status as captain on the left sleeve of the Jersey used during the Match.
13. Each Club must send samples of the First, second and third Jersey for both Players and goalkeepers no later than 7 days before *the kick-off* of the first Match.
14. Clubs must make a notification letter to I.League if there is a special kits change that will be used in a particular Match by filling out the form and sending a sample Jersey to I.League no later than 5 days before the Match.
15. Violation of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 40

### MATCH JERSEY COLOR ASSIGNMENT PROCEDURE

1. Match Jersey color assignment must be contrasting (dark and light) with the following procedure:
  - a. The host club will get priority to wear the main Jersey (outfield Players);
  - b. The away club will wear the home/away (outfield Players) Jersey if the color contrasts with the host Club's main (outfield Players) Jersey;
  - c. The host club will wear the Jersey (goalkeeper) by customizing the host Club's main Jersey (outfield Player) and the designated away Club's home/away Jersey (outfield Player);
  - d. The away club will use the Jersey (goalkeeper) by adjusting the main Jersey (outfield Player) of the host club, the home/away Jersey (outfield Player) of the away Club and the designated Jersey (goalkeeper) of the host Club;
  - e. The referee's kit color must match the jersey color of the host club and the away club;
  - f. The definition of contrast, in addition to dark and light is that there are no similar colors between the two teams, be it shirts, pants and socks. For example: if the host club is red-white-red, the visiting club is not allowed to use red on the pants and white on the shirt or both colors on the socks. Cross colors are not allowed, for example: red-white vs white-red.
2. Clubs must bring a minimum of 2 (two) sets of Jersey that have been registered at the time of the Match and are prepared to be shown at the match coordination meeting. The first violation of this is subject to a fine of IDR 30,000,000 (thirty million Indonesian rupiah), for repetition of this violation a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah) and multiples apply.
3. The assignment of the Uniform to be used by the participating Club as stipulated in paragraph (1) of this Article is decided at the match coordination meeting. If the Jersey colors are not contrasting, then both Clubs must be willing to accept changes in the color combination of the main Uniform, second and so on as determined by the match commissioner.
4. Each Official registered in the Match form must wear the same Kits as registered and not use the same color as the color of the participating Players' Jersey and the Referee's kit.

## ARTICLE 41

### NUMBER AND NAME

1. Each Player, when playing in a Match, must wear a Jersey with their name and number registered and authorized by I.League on the back. The position of the Player's name on the Jersey may be above or below the jersey number. The Player's number must also be attached to the left front of the Player's pants. If this cannot be accomplished, the Player concerned will not be able to play in the Match.
2. The Player's name on the Jersey must match the name on the back registered with the I. League. The name on the back may be registered with the name shown on the KTP/passport data or a popular name. I.League is authorized to order the Club to change the name on the Uniform if it does not match the registered name and such change must be notified to I.League. If this cannot be done, the Player concerned will not be able to play in the Match.
3. Writing only the initials of the letters of the Player's name on the Jersey is not allowed. If this is done, the Player concerned will not be able to play in the Match.
4. The use of colors for numbers and names on the Jersey adjusts to the color of the Jersey to avoid doubts in terms of recording information and the interests of live television broadcasts.
5. The font or type of writing used as the number and name on the back of the Player's and Goalkeeper's Jerseys must use writing that can be seen and read clearly.
6. Players must use numbers between 1 (one) and 99 (ninety-nine) to be installed on the Jersey as stipulated in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article. Especially for back numbers 1 (one) must be reserved for goalkeepers. The use of 2 (two) digit back numbers is only allowed for back numbers 10 (ten) up to back number 99 (ninety nine).
7. Violations of this Article shall be subject to a fine of IDR 30,000,000 (thirty million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 42

### BADGE

1. The BRI Super League badge is mandatory on the Jersey used by the Club in Matches. The placement of the badge on the right sleeve of the Player's Uniform and no other badges are allowed on the right sleeve. Violation of this will be subject to a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah).
2. The defending BRI Super League Champion Club must use a special badge prepared by I.League.
3. I.League may request Clubs and referees to use other badges related to the promotion of the BRI Super League on Club and referee kits.

# X. MATCH PROCEDURES

## ARTICLE 43

### WARM-UP

1. Each participating Club is entitled to the opportunity to warm up on the Field of Play before the start of the Match except for weather reasons that do not allow warmup to be carried out by observing the following conditions:
  - a. each team uses half the area of the Field of Play adjacent to the bench of the team concerned;
  - b. warmup starts from 50 minutes to 20 minutes before kick-off;
  - c. the duration of warmup is 30 minutes;
  - d. in rainy conditions or poor conditions in the area in front of the goal, the match commissioner has the right to prohibit the goalkeeper from warming up in that area and directed to another area. In these conditions, players are prohibited from performing a rondo;
  - e. in order to maintain the quality of the Field of Play, players are not recommended to do rondos in front of the bench area or one point of the Field of Play (so as to change areas every 3-5 minutes);
  - f. the provisions of this paragraph apply to all Players who will play in the Match.
2. During the duration of the Match, no more than 6 (six) reserve Players from each Club are allowed to warm up at the same time but are not allowed to use the ball (except for goalkeepers). The warmup area is at a place determined by the match commissioner. Players may be accompanied by a maximum of 2 (two) Officials listed on the E-startlist.
3. If the Club requests cooldown on the Field of Play after the Match, it shall be for a maximum of 20 minutes with only the involvement of the participating Players. The Match commissioner has the right to refuse cooldown if the Club is deemed to be conducting an additional training session for all participating and non-participating Players, and if the pitch condition is deemed to require maintenance.

## ARTICLE 44

### MATCH FORM

1. Each Club can access the Player Assignment Form (FPP ~Ind.) and Official Assignment Form (FPO ~Ind.) online via <https://lias.ileague.id/clubdashboard>. The FPP and FPO are used to obtain information from the Club regarding the composition and number of Players to be used, the status of the Players who can be played, the name and jersey number of each Player along with the composition and number of Club officials.
2. The Club marks 11 (eleven) main Players and 12 (twelve) reserve Players on the LIAS online club dashboard system. The names and jersey numbers used must match those listed on the FPP online in LIAS. For goalkeepers and captains, special markings must be given, including the position of each main player and reserve player.
3. Clubs must play at least 1 (one) U-23 Indonesian Player in the starting XI with a minimum playing duration of 45 minutes. Further provisions regarding U-23 Players are set out in Appendix 4.
4. In the event that all U-23 Players owned by the Club are called up or used for the benefit of the Indonesian National Team, the Club is permitted to play other registered Players.
5. Violation of paragraph (3) of this Article shall be subject to a fine of IDR 200,000,000 (two hundred million Indonesian rupiah).
6. Club can include a maximum of 7 (seven) foreign players in the starting XI. The other 2 (two) foreign players can be registered as reserve players, as long as the pitch is a maximum of 7 (seven) foreign players. The Club is responsible for player assignments. Violation of this article may result in the Club losing 0-3.
7. Officials registered on the Officials Assignment Form are a maximum of 11 (eleven) people as stipulated in Article 19.
8. The Match Form must be set through the LIAS system by the Club concerned no later than 90 minutes before kick-off. Furthermore, the match commissioner will compile the FPP and FPO of each Club that has been submitted in the LIAS system into an E-startlist. If the submission is made by the Club more than -90 minutes of the match, it will be subject to a fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah) with the exception of provable system interference.
9. The match commissioner distributes the E-startlist no later than 80 minutes before kick-off.

10. After the match commissioner distributes the E-startlist and the match has not yet started, it is permissible to change/substitute Players for any reason in the FPP with regard to the following matters:
  - a. if any of the 11 (eleven) main Players listed on the E-starting list is replaced for any reason, it can only be replaced by one of the 12 (twelve) reserve Players listed on the E- starting list;
  - b. the Club manager and/or coach must immediately communicate the change to the match commissioner and the match commissioner will make the change;
  - c. the substituted player is not allowed to play. The club is still allowed to make 5 (five) player substitutions during the Match;
  - d. foreign players registered as reserve Players cannot exceed the quota as stipulated in paragraph (6) of this Article;
  - e. Players listed as reserve Players in the E-startlist cannot be replaced. In the event that a reserve player is unable to play for any reason, it will reduce the number of reserve players listed in the E-startlist;
  - f. particularly goalkeepers listed on the E-startlist who are unable to play due to injury, in this case there are only 2 (two) goalkeepers listed on the E-startlist, they can be replaced by goalkeepers whose names are not listed on *the* E-startlist but have been registered by the Club for the BRI Super League.
  
11. The match commissioner must notify the change of E-startlist to both participating Clubs immediately after the approval of the changes/substitutions is made.

## ARTICLE 45

### MATCH PROTOCOL

1. Both of participating clubs must be at the stadium no later than 90 minutes before kick-off.
2. Clubs must punctually follow and comply with the official match countdown series released by the match commissioner from 90 minutes to the kick-off of the match without exception.
3. Before both clubs enter the pitch, the BRI Super League anthem must be played to accompany the Players entering the pitch.
4. Clubs may play the home club's anthem before kick-off subject to compliance with the official match countdown.

5. In all BRI Super League Matches, Players shall shake hands with Players of the opposing Club and the referee's official after the Match ceremony and after the Match has finished.
6. VIP handshakes are allowed to be carried out at the Match with the provision of a maximum of 5 (five) VIPs who can come down to the field of play to carry out a handshake procession with Players and Match Officials after the Match ceremony. This implementation affects the time sequence in the official match countdown but must not delay the kick-off of the match.
7. If there is a moment of silence (due to a grieving situation), it is carried out at the time after the Match ceremony and shortly before kick-off, with the command of the implementation led by the referee.
8. If there is a commercial activation or special event close to kick-off, it can only be held up to a maximum of 2 minutes before the Match ceremony procession (before march-in).
9. Cooling break can be carried out with consideration of the results of measuring extreme air temperatures that pose a risk to Players safety during the Match by using a Wet Bulb Globe Temperature (WBGT) device or other device that can measure temperature. The checking time is carried out at 90 minutes and/or 60 minute before kick-off and the end of the first half by the medical officer. If the temperature is above 32°C then a cooling break can be done for 3 minutes.

## ARTICLE 46

### TEAM BENCH AND TECHNICAL AREA

1. Only 12 (twelve) participating players and 11 (eleven) participating Officials are allowed to sit on the team bench. The names of these personnel and their functions must be listed on the E-startlist and authorized by the match commissioner. Each of these personnel must use the accreditation that has been issued by I.League and is worn at all times that is easy to see. *The match commissioner* and/or referee may expel personnel who are not entitled and no competence or interest in the team bench.
2. Officials who must sit on *the team bench* are the head coach and the doctor. If the registered doctor is unable to accompany the team, they must be replaced by a substitute doctor appointed by Club and approved by I.League.
3. Personnel entitled sit on the referee's bench are the fourth official, general coordinator, media officer and Football Technology & Innovation (FTI) officer.

4. All personnel sitting on the team bench must wear clothing that contrasts with the participating Club's Jersey and the referee's kit and has been decided at the match coordination meeting.
5. The host club will occupy the left team bench (viewed from the main stand located behind the team bench).
6. Only 1 (one) person (head coach or other Official listed in the E-startlist) may give tactical instructions from inside *the technical area* to Player who plays during Match ongoing And quick after give instructions mandatory for quick return Sit down to *team bench*. Exception only For interpreter which can operate its function accompany coach head when give instructions to the Players, but not throughout the Match, the interpreter returns to the bench after completing his duties.
7. All over party No allowed For smoke in form And type cigarette anything including e-cigarettes in the technical area.
8. Players (including reserve/substituted players and red carded players) are not allowed to use electronic communication device of any kind. The use of EPTS (Electronic Performance and Tracking Systems) is permitted and must be in accordance with the LOTG.
9. The use of electronic communication devices by Officials is permitted where it is directly related to Player safety or for coaching tactical/technical reasons in small, mobile, or handheld devices (e.g., laptops and tablet computers). The Match Officials reserve the right to request the Officials to stop the use of such electronic devices if it is found that they are being used for other purposes that are not in accordance with the LOTG and the Regulations.
10. The provisions regarding the use of communication devices (handy talky) by the head coach to the officials on the bench refer to the LOTG.
11. Violation of This article will be subject to a sanction of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 47

### SUBSTITUTION OF PLAYERS

1. It is Allowed that a maximum of 5 (five) reserve players registered in the e-startlist can play in the match. In the process of substitution time opportunities, the fourth official must use the substitution board where there are numbers on both sides.
2. The substitution time mechanism during the Match can only be done with the following procedures:
  - a. during the game (2x45 minute), each Club only has 3 (three) substitution opportunities where in one substitution opportunity can make up to a maximum of 5 (five) substitutions, depending on the remaining substitution quota;
  - b. during the half-time, Clubs are allowed to make substitutions as long as they still have a quota of substitutions. The substitution during the half-time does not reduce the weight of the provisions of the number of 3 (three) times the opportunity for substitution during the game as stated in paragraph (2) letter a of this Article;
  - c. referring to LOTG, concussion substitution beyond the used substitution quota may be made in the event of a head injury.

## ARTICLE 48

### VIP

1. VIP activities specifically relating to the area of Field of Play in the opening and final matches will be arranged specifically by the I.League.
2. VIP handshakes may be conducted at BRI Super League Matches upon approval by the I.League.
3. The Club gurantees that no VIP visits/unregistered personnel enter the locker room area of the Stadium prior to, and during, the Match.
4. VIP visits to the locker room can only be made during the 15 minutes after the Match ends, with a maximum of 5 (five) VIP personnel using the *locker room pass* submitted by the *match commissioner* in the second half of the Match. *Locker room pass* cannot be used as a tool to enter the FOP area .
5. Violation of paragraphs (3) and (4) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 200,000,000 (two hundred million Indonesian rupiah).

# XI. MEDICAL AND ANTI-DOPING

## ARTICLE 49

### PRE-COMPETITION MEDICAL ASSESSMENT

1. Each participating Club must ensure each participating Player undergoes a Pre-Competition Medical Assessment (PCMA) no later than 7 (seven) days prior to its first Match of the Competition:
  - a. Players who have undergone a PCMA for a FIFA or other AFC competition may submit the document by attaching a declaration stating that the document is correct and valid for 1 (one) competition season;
  - b. PSSI shall provide the PCMA form to be filled out by the Club including the required tests;
  - c. the participating Club must submit the PCMA document to PSSI no later than 5 (days) prior to the first match of the competition;
  - d. failure to submit PCMA documents will result in the Player concerned not being authorized to play in the BRI Super League.
2. I.League and the PSSI Medical Committee may, at its sole discretion, order any further medical evaluations of a participating Player that it deems necessary. The cost of such further testing shall be borne by I.League.

## ARTICLE 50

### MEDICAL

1. The Local Organizing Committee must prepare medical facilities related to the implementation of the Matches, starting from 2 (two) days before the Match to 1 (one) day after the Match, as follows:
  - a. at least 2 (two) referral hospitals (at least class B) for emergency purposes, and have made an agreement between the hospital and the Club;
  - b. medical room at the Stadium for emergency purposes equipped with medical facilities;
  - c. certified doctors and paramedics;
  - d. minimum 8 (eight) stretcher bearers;
  - e. minimum 4 (four) ambulance units, consisting of 2 (two) ambulance units inside the stadium (edge of the Field of Play) and 2 (two) ambulance units outside the stadium;
  - f. a medical post outside the Stadium for spectators with adequate facilities (if there are spectators).

2. Each participating Club is responsible for the costs of any medical treatment provided to members of that Club including spectators.
3. The Club must bear its own costs of medical treatment from 2 (two) days before the Match until 1 (one) day after the Match for the following:
  - a. *outpatient treatment;*
  - b. *minor surgeries;*
  - c. *radiological investigations; And*
  - d. *emergency treatment.*
4. The host club, at its own expense, must prepare in every Match the following:
  - a. a medical room adjacent to the locker rooms and the pitch and equipped with the following medical equipment and tools:
    - i. at least 2 (two) examination tables & treatment tables;
    - ii. at least 2 (two) hardboard stretchers or spinal stretchers with head blocks;
    - iii. intubation equipment;
    - iv. oxygen cylinder with a minimum capacity of 2000 litres or portable oxygen with a minimum capacity of 400 litres;
    - v. defibrillator with rhythm and patient data recording;
    - vi. intravenous drip;
    - vii. splints;
    - viii. stethoscope ;
    - ix. oxygen mask (nebulizer mask);
    - x. suction machine;
    - xi. running water;
    - xii. emergency medicine (oral and injection);
    - xiii. symptomatic medicine ;
    - xiv. minor surgery set (2 (two) sets);
    - xv. CPR and ET set;
    - xvi. Neck collar;
    - xvii. toilet;
    - xviii. other health support tools.
  - b. ambulance equipped with:
    - i. stretcher;
    - ii. spinal boards;
    - iii. splints;
    - iv. defibrillator (AED);
    - v. intubation equipment;
    - vi. nebulizer;
    - vii. suction machine;
    - viii. portable oxygen cylinders;
    - ix. ACLS and other emergency drugs.

- c. The stretcher crew is equipped with :
  - i. stethoscope;
  - ii. oximeter pulse;
  - iii. oxygen & tubing;
  - iv. infusion equipment;
  - v. pupil lamp;
  - vi. disposable gloves;
  - vii. basket stretcher, substitute for box spints or long spinal board complete with head immobilizer, cervical collar & cervical upper spinal immobilization devices (minimum)
5. Availability of at least 2 (two) ambulance units and at least 1 (one) unit of automated external defibrillator (AED) in the FOP Area.
6. Medical officers are required to check and ensure the function, quality, and quantity of related types/items in accordance with the provisions and their designation so that they function properly as mentioned in the points above.
7. Violations of paragraphs (4) and (5) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million rupiah).

## ARTICLE 51

### DOPING

1. Doping is prohibited with reference to FIFA Anti-Doping, AFC Anti-Doping Regulations, PSSI Disciplinary Code, rules, circulars, and other directives related to anti-doping that bind the parties subject to the PSSI Statutes.
2. PSSI and/or I.League are authorized to conduct doping tests during the implementation of BRI Super League at any time without prior notice.
3. Doping-test procedures are regulated by separate provisions.
4. Other provisions related to the Club's obligations in the implementation of this Article are further regulated by separate provisions made by PSSI and/or I. League.
5. Local Organizing Committee shall provide a doping-test room as regulated in the Manual.

## XII. DISCIPLINE

### ARTICLE 52

#### DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

1. Disciplinary procedures and appeals during the BRI Super League refer to the PSSI Statutes, PSSI Disciplinary Code, PSSI Code of Ethics and other circulars issued by PSSI and/or I.League that are relevant to the implementation of the BRI Super League.
2. PSSI may implement new disciplinary rules and forms of sanctions during the implementation of the BRI Super League which will be announced no later than 1 month prior to the effective period of the rules and sanctions.
3. PSSI and/or I.League may conduct special investigations into allegations or indications of disciplinary violations that are contrary to the PSSI Statutes, PSSI Disciplinary Code, PSSI Code of Ethics and other circulars issued by I.League and/or PSSI that are relevant to the implementation of the BRI Super League including reporting any disciplinary violations in the BRI Super League to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
4. The PSSI Disciplinary Committee is authorized to impose disciplinary sanctions against all disciplinary violations during the BRI Super League that are contrary to the PSSI Statutes, the PSSI Disciplinary Code, the PSSI Code of Ethics and other circulars issued by the I.League and/or PSSI that are relevant to the implementation of the BRI Super League.
5. All violations that occur in the Regulations will be sanctioned by PSSI.

### ARTICLE 53

#### INTERFERENCE WITH THE MATCH

1. Matters that interfere during the Match such as and against such matters shall be subject to sanctions in accordance with the PSSI Disciplinary Code, including but not limited to:
  - a. flares, fireworks, smoke bombs, whistles, lasers, firecrackers, devices that make noise;
  - b. throwing an object into the pitch;
  - c. banners bearing messages and/or displaying images with racial, political, hate speech, provocative, and discriminatory content;
  - d. pitch invasion;

- e. chants or other things that have racial, political, hate speech, provocative and discriminatory tones that can be categorized as a disciplinary violation.
  - f. misuse of supporting facilities that are not in accordance with their function, including but not limited to the use of fire hydrants and/or other supporting facilities.
2. Further provisions for this article are regulated in the Manual.
  3. Violations of this Article will be subject to fines in accordance with the PSSI Disciplinary Committee hearing or the provisions of the special team that has been determined.

## ARTICLE 54

### BEHAVIOR AND ETIQUETTE

1. Clubs are responsible for the behavior and ethics of:
  - a. Players
  - b. Officials and all elements of the club;
  - c. spectators; and/or
  - d. every person involved or in charge of the implementation of BRI Super League.
2. Every person involved in accordance with paragraph (1) must declare willing to comply with all the rules listed on Appendix 5 and all applicable provisions under the PSSI & I.League.
3. If everyone involved in accordance with paragraph (1) does not comply with the rules listed, then the club or I.League can take any/all of the following actions including but not limited to those set out in Appendix 5.
4. Violations of this Article may be subject to additional penalties, namely a minimum fine of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah) and/or sanctions regulated in the PSSI Disciplinary Code.

## ARTICLE 55

### YELLOW CARD AND RED CARD

1. Clubs are responsible for monitoring yellow cards and/or red cards and the status of penalties received by their respective Players and Officials and ensuring all such Player and Official are registered and eligible to be involved in the Match. Objections or protests lodged after the end of the Match will be disregarded.
2. Clubs are obliged to submit information on Players or Officials who are punished for card sanctions or disciplinary sanctions during the match coordination meeting. Negligence or failure to comply with this shall be the responsibility of the Club and shall be subject to sanctions in accordance with the PSSI Disciplinary Code.
3. Players who accumulate 4 (four) yellow cards in 4 (four) different matches during the BRI Super League are not allowed to play 1 (one) Match in the next match after the accumulation is reached. This one Match ban rule also applies to every accumulation of 3 (three) subsequent yellow cards in 3 (three) different matches during the BRI Super League.
4. Players who accumulate 2 (two) yellow cards in a Match which results in the player concerned receiving a red card (indirect), are not allowed to play 1 (one) Match in the next Match.
5. Players who receive red card (direct) are not allowed to play 1 (one) match in the next match. If there is an indication that the disciplinary action that resulted in the red card could result in a heavier sanction under the PSSI Disciplinary Code, the match commissioner must submit the matter to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
6. Players who get a yellow card and then get a red card (directly) in the same match are not allowed to play 1 (one) match in the next match and the provisions as stipulated in paragraph (5) of this Article apply.
7. Players who get an accumulation of 4 (four) yellow cards as stipulated in paragraph (3) of this Article are subject to a fine of IDR 5,000,000 (five million Indonesian rupiah). Next, players who get every accumulation of 3 (three) yellow cards as stipulated in paragraph (3) of this Article shall be fine IDR 7,000,000 (seven million Indonesian rupiah).
8. Players who get a red card (indirect) as stipulated in paragraph (4) of this Article are subject to a fine of IDR 10,000,000 (ten million Indonesian rupiah).
9. Players who get a red card (direct) as stipulated in paragraphs (5) and (6) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 15,000,000 (fifteen million rupiah).
10. Players who get 2 (two) yellow card in the same Match then automatically the player concerned gets a red card (indirect), then the previous 2 (two) yellow cards

given to the player are not valid for the purpose of calculating the overall yellow card accumulation as stipulated in paragraph (3) of this Article and he is punished based on the red card (indirect) received and subject to sanctions as referred to in paragraph (4) of this Article.

11. Players who get 1 (one) yellow card then in the same Match the Player concerned gets a red card (direct), then the previous yellow card given to the Player is still valid for the purpose of calculating the overall yellow card accumulation as stipulated in paragraph (3) of this Article and he is punished based on the red card (direct) received and subject to the sanction as referred to in paragraph (6) of this Article.
12. In the event that a Player is unable to play in a Match due to accumulation of yellow cards or red cards but the Match Schedule has been changed or postponed, the sanctions against the Player concerned shall be carried out and apply in the Match in which he should not be able to play. For example: Player A should not be able to play in the Match against Club B but due to a change in the schedule the Match against Club B is postponed after the Match against Club C then the Player concerned can play against Club C and cannot play against Club B.
13. Officials who accumulate 2 (two) yellow cards in 2 (two) different matches during the BRI Super League are not allowed to accompany 1 (one) match in the next match after the accumulation is reached. This rule also applies to subsequent multiples (fourth, sixth, eighth, and so on).
14. Officials who receive a red card (direct/indirect) are not allowed to accompany the Club for 1 (one) Match in the next Match. If there is an indication that the disciplinary action that results in a red card (direct) may result in a heavier sanction based on PSSI Disciplinary Code, The match commissioner is obliged to submit the matter to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee. Officials who get a red card (direct) are subject to a fine of IDR 20,000,000 (twenty million Indonesian rupiah).
15. Players and/or officials who are sent off by the referee are not allowed to be in the team bench and technical area. Expelled players are allowed to be in the locker room or doping room if there is doping control. Expelled Players and/or officials are allowed to sit in the stands but not in the area directly adjacent to the field of play. If the Official is sent off in the first half, he is not allowed to enter the locker room during the half-time period.
16. Players and/or officials sent off by the referee are not allowed to attend the post-match press conference.
17. Violation of paragraph (16) of this Article shall be subject to a fine of IDR 25,000,000 (twenty five million Indonesian rupiah).

18. Players and/or Officials who receive a yellow card and/or a red card and have not expired and then move to another Club in the same competitive season, the yellow card and/or red card is still valid and attached to the Player at his new Club. The new Club must know and be responsible for the yellow card and/or red card and the status of the sanction received by the Player and/or Official.
19. If the player is subject to a playing ban as well as a fine and has served his suspension period but has not yet been paid, then the person concerned remains in the status of a sanction.
20. Additional provisions regarding red cards follow the rules set out in the PSSI Disciplinary Code.

## ARTICLE 56

### ACTION VIOLENCE AND DISCIPLINARY

1. Any individual reported or seen committing acts of violence and indiscipline in the Stadium area (including but not limited to the locker room or Field of Play Area) or at any other venue included as part of the Match will be forwarded to the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.
2. For any damage to infrastructure and supporting facilities carried out intentionally or unintentionally by individuals who are not identified based on the results of the investigation, the Club will be charged with the obligation to compensate for material losses and additional sanctions determined by the PSSI Disciplinary Committee.

## ARTICLE 57

### PROTEST

1. A protest is an objection to any matter that has a direct effect on the Match including:
  - a. pitch size and condition;
  - b. player accessories;
  - c. match equipment;
  - d. player status;
  - e. match ball;
  - f. stadium maintenances; and
  - g. related to violations of the Regulations.

2. The Club has the right to file a protest submitted in writing through the official protest form issued by I.League to *the match commissioner* no later than 2 hours after the match ends and immediately followed up by submitting a complete report in writing including proof of submission of the protest to I.League (by providing a copy of the complete report to PSSI) no later than 48 hours after the Match ends where the protest is filed. A protest fee of IDR 5,000,000 (five million Indonesian rupiah) will be charged for this matter which is non-refundable.
3. In the event that the protest submitted is not in accordance with the conditions and facts and is not submitted through the mechanism as stipulated in the Regulations, then the protest is considered non-existent and will not be processed.
4. Protests may not be conveyed in relation to the referee's decision during the Match. The referee decision is final and binding as well as no can compared to unless otherwise regulated in the PSSI Disciplinary Code, the same applies to VAR referee decisions, which will be applied during the BRI Super League.
5. Any form of protest by the Players against the referee's staff during the Match is only may delivered by captain, protest are not valid for other Players. Outside of these provisions will be given a yellow card.
6. All protest which delivered will decided by I. League. Decision was made by I.League issued under this Article is final and binding and no appeal can be made against it.
7. Reports on matters relating to the referee's officiating may be submitted or reported by the Club directly in writing to the PSSI referee committee, but shall not constitute a change in any decisions made during the Match.

## XIII. MEDIA

### ARTICLE 58

#### MEDIA

1. Each participating Club oblige to have an official Club website and place a link to the official I.League website ([www.ileague.id](http://www.ileague.id)) on the Club's official website page.
2. Violation of this Article shall be sanctioned in accordance with the contribution scheme coefficient.

### ARTICLE 59

#### MEDIA ACCREDITATION

1. The media accreditation process is conducted by I.League through the I.League media channel. Clubs are responsible for conveying information to local media who will apply for media accreditation.
2. I.League publish the accreditation format and is responsible for the ID card design. The format and design of the ID card issued by I.League is printed by the Local Organizing Committee (media officer) using the system provided by I.League via <https://lias.ileague.id/clubdashboard>.
3. The media officer is responsible for the joint event approval of the BRI Super League on the I.League media channel including the issuance of media ID cards. If any violation of the provisions and regulations determined by I.League based on the Regulations or other provisions related to the BRI Super League, I.League reserves the right to revoke and cancel the validation of the media ID card.
4. I.League responsible for producing media vests for photographers, RTV, NRH, social media Club, and TV production crew (HB). The Local Organizing Committee is responsible for the distribution and collection of photographer's vests, before and after the Match.
5. Local Organizing committee shall take protective actions for the commentary area, media stands, placement of television cameras, and items belonging to TV production.
6. The Club reserves the right to take pictures/videos (technical camera) for the sole purpose of analyzing the Club. The Club's video technical analyst must be included in the 20 (twenty) Officials registered by the Club.
7. The Club's video technical analyst may only take photos/videos in areas designated

by the I.League. Such images/videos are prohibited for the purposes of live streaming, social media, or other commercial purposes.

8. Violation of paragraphs (5), (6) and (7) of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 100,000,000 (one hundred million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 60

### MEDIA COVERAGE OF OFFICIAL TRAINING AT THE STADIUM

1. All official training session at the Stadium must open to the media.
2. If there is a request from one of the Clubs to hold a closed practice from the media, there must still be at least an opportunity for the media to cover the first 15 minutes of official training.
3. Media coverage is not permitted in the drop-off area.
4. The placement of coverage location in the area around the field of play during official training is set by the media officer with the approval of the match commissioner.
5. There is no interview activity with Players and Officials in the Field of Play area before, during and after official training.
6. The media officer must ensure that all media covering official training and entering the Stadium are accredited.

## ARTICLE 61

### PRESS CONFERENCE

1. The host club is responsible for organizing the pre-match press conference conducted by the host club's media officer 1 (one) day before the match.
2. The head coach and 1 (one) Player in the starting XI of both participating Clubs must attend and participate in the pre-match press conference. The media officers of both participating Clubs must ensure the presence of the head coach and Player at the pre-match press conference. No other personnel are allowed to attend the pre-match press conference.

3. The head coach and 1 (one) player who play in the Match must attend the post-match press conference held at the stadium and starting no later than 15 minutes after the end of the match. The Media officers of both participating Clubs must ensure the presence of the head coach and one player. No other personnel are allowed to attend the post-match press conference.
4. Head coaches or Players who are banned (yellow card accumulation and/or disciplinary sanctions) or red carded during the match, are not allowed to attend any press conference activities (pre-match press conference and/or post-match press conference). Head coaches who are subject to punishment can only be represented by assistant coaches.
5. An Interpreter is permitted during press conference sessions . Each participating club is responsible for ensuring the provision of interpreting services for participating players and/or head coaches participating in press conference sessions in a foreign language.
6. Pre-match press conferences may be conducted online. In certain circumstances, pre-match press conferences may be conducted on a hybrid basis with the approval of the I.League. Online or hybrid post-match press conferences are not allowed. This provision only applies to the away club.
7. Violation of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 25,000,000,- (twenty five million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 62

### MEDIA ACCESS

1. Non-right holder (NRH) written, radio and television journalists are not permitted on the Field of Play area or the area between the pitch boundary and the spectators before, during and after the Match.
2. Only accredited photographers, TV production crews, I.League digital crews may be in the area between the spectators and Field of Play perimeter, where they will conduct their work in a specifically designated area, listed on the accreditation. The number of accredited photographers, I.League digital and TV production crew who may be in the area between the spectators and the Field of Play perimeter is limited in accordance with the Manual.
3. The Club reserves the right to limit the number of media crews covering in accordance with the capacity of the media stands and the availability of other facilities at the Stadium.

4. Locker room area is off-limits to any media at any time during the BRI Super League. Clubs shall ensure their media personnel observe this policy. It is permissible for I.League digital and TV production crews to capture the locker room situation prior to the Club's arrival.
5. I.League and TV Production have free access to the Stadium 2 (two) days before the Match until 1 (one) day after Match, for technical purposes of installing facilities supporting the live broadcast of the Match.
6. The host club is responsible for ensuring the rights and interests of the I.League digital and TV productions are protected, so that no NRH shoots at the Stadium without permission or approval from the I.League.
7. Violation to this Article shall be subject to a fine of IDR 150,000,000,- (one hundred and fifty million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 63

### MIXED ZONE

1. The use of Mixed zone must be operated 15 minute after the Match ends.
2. All Club members must pass through *the mixed zone* on their way from the locker rooms to the bus after the Match.
3. The *media officers* must ensure that media coverage entering *the mixed zone area* is accredited.
4. Violations of this Article will be subject to a sanctions of IDR 50,000,000 (fifty million Indonesian rupiah).

## ARTICLE 64

### INTERVIEW

1. If there is an interview requested by I.League, both participating Clubs must be willing to allow their head coach and/or one of their Players to be interviewed by TV Production and/or I.League with a maximum duration of 10 minutes. The *interview* shall be conducted 1 (one) day before the Match at a location determined by I.League.
2. If requested by I.League, both participating Clubs must be willing to allow the head coach to be interviewed by TV Production and/or I.League with a maximum duration of 90 seconds. *Coach arrival interviews* are conducted upon the Club's arrival at the Stadium.

3. In all Stadium area, before, during and after the Match, the media (including TV Production) are not allowed to interview the Match Officials on duty. This prohibition includes live recording of discussions between Match Officials in all Stadium situations.
4. Flash interviews of a maximum of 90 seconds may be conducted after the Match, involving a maximum of 3 (three) players per Club after Match has end, having been previously coordinated and informed by the TV production team.
5. Man of the match requested by the technical study group who is asked by *the Technical Study Group (TSG)* team to conduct *a flash interview* must fulfill and carry out the request.
6. Violation of this Article will be subject to a fine of IDR 25,000,000 (twenty five million Indonesian rupiah).

## XIV. COMMERCIAL

### ARTICLE 65

#### COMMERCIAL

1. I.League is the sole holder of the commercial rights of BRI Super League.
2. Exploitation of commercial rights in the BRI Super League:
  - a. Media rights; including:
    - Promotional media;
    - Print media;
    - digital/online media;
    - broadcast media.
  - b. all media rights in BRI Super League belong to I.League;
  - c. intellectual property rights.
  - d. other commercial rights.
3. The I.League has the exclusive right to exploit other commercial rights and appoint commercial partners in BRI Super League. Commercial partners appointed by the I.League have the exclusive right to exploit several commercial rights (including for services and products) in the implementation of the BRI Super League and the Match.
4. Each participating Clubs to play shall be required to submit the latest LED board preview, in the form of a video rotation of the LED content at the stadium, no later than one (1) day prior to the match..
5. More complete provisions regarding marketing, commercial and promotional materials are regulated separately in the BRI Super League Marketing Regulations .
6. Violations of this Article will be subject to fines in accordance with the provisions set out in the Marketing Regulations.

## ARTICLE 66

### TELEVISION AND BROADCAST RIGHTS

1. I.League has the right to cooperate with television stations (host broadcaster) that will broadcast the BRI Super League by taking into account aspects of transparency.
2. I.League is entitled television broadcasting rights nationally and internationally.
3. I.League has the right to broadcast Matches on live streaming. Provisions regarding live streaming are set out in the broadcast manual by I.League.
4. Together I.League and the host broadcaster determine which matches will be broadcast live or delayed.
5. The host club must ensure there is no recording of the Match by TVs other than the official I.League host broadcaster .
6. Clubs are prohibited to record/publish/take videos (live streaming and live on social media platforms ) of matches without I.League approval.
7. Violation of this Article will be sanctioned in the form of a fine of IDR 200,000,000 (two hundred million Indonesian rupiah).

## **XV. TICKETING**

### **ARTICLE 67**

#### **TICKETING PROVISIONS**

1. The host club is responsible for ensuring Ticket sales do not exceed the Stadium capacity or the capacity permitted by the police through recommendations.
2. All match tickets must be sold through the online Ticketing Management System (TMS). Further provisions are explained in the Marketing Regulations.
3. Local Organizing Committee is responsible for the production, distribution and sale of Match Tickets. I.League may provide an assist in creating ticket design templates for Clubs.
4. Each Ticket must include the BRI Super League competition logo and BRI Super League official sponsor logo.
5. Local Organizing Committee must ensure and guarantee the availability of access for PSSI and/or I.League delegates, VIP/VVIP guest Clubs, sponsors, host broadcasters and media without discrimination based on gender, race or nationality.
6. Local Organizing Committee must provide complimentary tickets for the away Club as many as 25 (twenty-five) seats in the closed stand/VIP category and as many as 2 (two) seats in the main VVIP category and 3 (three) seats in the second layer VVIP category.
7. Local Organizing Committee must provide complimentary tickets for I.League sponsor partners with the amount regulated in the BRI Super League Marketing Regulations.
8. Further provisions regarding paragraphs (4), (5) & (6) refer to as written in the Marketing Regulations.
9. Official I.League representatives and I.League partners must be placed in the VIP stands.

# XVI. FINANCIAL

## ARTICLE 68

### FINANCIAL

1. I.League has the following financial obligations:
  - a. contribution for participating Club which are divided into:
    - i. *fixed* contribution;
    - ii. variables contribution.
  - b. Local accommodation of the Match Officials;
  - c. Task allowance and transportation of the Match officials from the home city to the venue city; and
  - d. other bills by any name and in any form as regulated further by notificates, directives, or decrees.
  
2. Clubs have the following financial obligations:
  - a. pay the definitive fines set by the PSSI Disciplinary Committee for violations as stipulated in the BRI Super League Regulations and the PSSI Disciplinary Code;
  - b. the return of any fees or contributions received in respect of the Club's participation in the event of a breach of the Rules and regulations set by PSSI and/or I.League;
  - c. insurance for Players and Official;
  - d. other matters determined by PSSI and/or I.League relating to financial aspects.
  
3. I.League has the right to make deductions from the Club's contribution to the implementation of the BRI Super League specifically in the event that a certain amount of fees is required for the payment of administrative fees for foreign players and other conditions mutually agreed between the Club and the I.League .
  - a. specifically for card fine payments in the implementation of the BRI Super League, deductions will be made from the Club's contribution;
  - b. Clubs are required to have a bank account number in the name of the Club and/or business entity according to applicable laws and regulations;

- c. financial administration provisions are as following:
- i. Clubs are required to submit notifications regarding the Club's financial information to I.League via a financial form signed by the Club's CEO/Director;
  - ii. Against the provision in paragraph (3) letter a of this Article, I.League reserves the right to refuse the payment if the account number does not match the account number registered with I.League;
  - iii. in the event of a change in information as referred to in paragraph (3) letters a and b of this Article, the Club is obliged to provide written notification to I.League which has been signed by the Club CEO/Director.
- d. All communications relating to I.League financial information to Clubs or Clubs to I.League, shall be in accordance with provisions in this article And submitted in writing by postal mail or *email* to the following address:

4. Club payments for definitive fines and/or other provisions are made by direct deduction from contributions and/or subsidies through a letter of confirmation or approval. For Clubs willing to make payments as mentioned above directly without deduction from contributions, this can be done through a bank transfer mechanism and then submit proof of transfer to the I.League financial department by email, with the account number:

5. All Club obligations incurred by the Club, part of the Club or the Local Organizing Committee will be billed to the Club.
6. All payment transactions are in Indonesian Rupiah.

7. All taxes arising in connection with payment transactions, both Income Tax and VAT, must be borne by each Party in accordance with the provisions regulated in the applicable tax regulations.
8. Each Club is required to fulfill all financial provisions stated in the Club Licensing Regulation and is required to report the current month's VAT Return via email to the I. League finance department.

# XVII. ADMINISTRATION

## ARTICLE 69

### AWARD AND PRIZES

1. The awards that will be given in the implementation of the BRI Super League are as follow:
  - a. Best player;
  - b. Top scorer;
  - c. Best goalkeeper;
  - d. Best young Player;
  - e. Best coach;
  - f. Fair-play award;
  - g. Best goal; and
  - h. Best eleven Players.
  - i. Other Awards to be determined later.
2. The golden ball trophy will be awarded to the BRI Super League's Player of the year.
3. The Golden Boot Trophy will be awarded to the top scorer in BRI Super League. If there are 2 (two) or more top scorers, the one who scores fewer goals from the penalty mark will be declared the recipient of the award. If the calculation still remains the same, the Players concerned are jointly set as the award recipient.
4. The golden glove trophy will be awarded to the BRI Super League's best goalkeeper.
5. The trophy for the best young player will be awarded to the BRI Super League's best young player.
6. The trophy for the best coach will be awarded to the best BRI Super League's coach.
7. The fair-play trophy will be awarded to the club deemed to be the most sporting throughout the BRI Super League based on calculations and procedures determined by the I.League.
8. The best goal trophy will be awarded to the Player who creates the best goal throughout the implementation BRI Super League based on evaluation whose procedures are set by I.League.
9. The best eleven players trophy will be awarded to the 11 (eleven) players who are deemed to have the best performance throughout the BRI Super League.

I.League will provide prize Money to individual who win an awards whose value will be determined later by the I.League.

## ARTICLE 70

### TROPHIES AND MEDAL

1. The winner club of the BRI Super League will be awarded a replica of the BRI Super League trophy to which the Club is entitled.
2. The BRI Super League trophy will be awarded to the winner club and will be allowed to keep it for three months. After that time, the winner club must return the trophy to the I.League.
3. The winner club of the BRI Super League is responsible for the conditions and damage that arise from the trophy stored by the Club during the specified time and must return the trophy to the I.League in good condition.
4. I.League is responsible for providing 55 (fifty five) gold medals medals for the BRI Super League Champion Club at the official presentation ceremony.

## ARTICLE 71

### COMMUNICATION AND INFORMATION

1. All forms of communication related to information, communication and administration of the I.League to the Club or Club to I.League shall be submitted in writing by post, telephone, and/or email to:

2. I.League will not honor any form of official communication other than as set forth in this Article.

## ARTICLE 72

### CLOSING

1. These regulation are made by the PSSI, to be fully implemented in accordance with the authority given by PSSI and apply to the BRI Super League, to be implemented and complied with by the Club and its implementation is supervised by PSSI and I. League.
2. If there are obious mistakes and matters that have not been regulated or not sufficiently regulated in this Article Regulations, will be determined and adjusted later by PSSI.

## APPENDIX 1

### FAIR PLAY RANKING

1. Each Club will earn points upon receiving a yellow card and red card as follows:
  - a. each yellow card received: 1 point;
  - b. each red card (accumulated yellow card) received: 3 points;
  - c. each red card (direct) received: 3 points; and
  - d. each yellow card followed by a (direct) red card: 4 points.
2. PSSI Disciplinary Committee sanction calculation.
3. The Club that gets the least points will be ranked the highest and so on following the points earned.

## APPENDIX 5

### RULES AND ETHICS OF THE GAME

#### 1. TEAM OFFICIALS AND TEAM MANAGEMENT

**Team officials and team management must comply with all rules listed, including;**

- a. Show respect for others involved in the game including but not limited to match officials, opponent player, coaches, managers, officials and spectators.
- b. Abide the LOTG and build the spirit of the game
- c. Promote fair play and good standards behavior
- d. Not engage in any form of match fixing, gambling, and similar activities
- e. Respect the referee's decision in the match
- f. Not enter the Field of Play without referee's permission.
- g. not engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behavior either in person or through social media posts.
- h. accept victory and defeat with generosity.
- i. Not engage in provocation, Language, behavior, hate speech and the like through mass media (print media, social media, television, or radio broadcasts) either direct (live) or indirectly.
- j. prioritizes the welfare, safety, and happiness of each player above everything else, including winning
- k. never engage in or tolerate all form of *bullying* and racism
- l. encourage each player to accept responsibility for their own behavior and performance
- m. cooperate fully with others in football (including but not limited to team officials, doctors, physiotherapists, match officials) in the best interests of each player.

**If the team officials and Club management do not comply with the rules stated, then the club or I.League may take any/all of the following actions including but not limited to :**

- a. required to fulfill the call-up of club management, I.League or related officers
- b. be banned from attending Matches
- c. suspended from participating in BRI Super League Competition
- d. fined by the PSSI Disciplinary Committee
- e. prohibited from participating in activities held by I. League.

## 2. PLAYER

**Each player participating in the I.League must obey all the rules listed, including;**

- a. play with the best ability for the benefit of the team.
- b. play according to the official rule written in LOTG.
- c. uphold fair *play*, stay away from all form of cheating, like diving, excessive protest, and time wasting.
- d. not involved in *match fixing* , gambling, or other forms of match result fixing.
- e. respect the final decision of the match officials, without provoking or opposing the referee and officials.
- f. accept victory and defeat with a big heart, and shake hands with the opposing team and the referee at the end of the match.
- g. display and model good behavior, both on and off the pitch.
- h. respect and be polite to teammates, opponents, coaches, managers, referees, and match officials.
- i. listen and respond to the coach's or manager's directions with an open attitude.
- j. understand that the coach act in the benefit of the team, not the individual.
- k. raise complaint or inconveniences through trusted and authorized club parties.
- l. not use offensive, insulting, abusive, or provocative language or behavior towards anyone.
- m. not engage in *bullying*, intimidation, racism, harassment, or hate speech of any kind.
- n. not to spread provocation or unethical behavior through mass media, including social media, television broadcasts, radio, or print media—either directly or indirectly.

**If the player does not comply with the rules listed, the club or I.League may take any/all of the following actions including but not limited to :**

- a. required to apologize to teammates, other team, referee, or manager
- b. receive a warning from the coach
- c. receive a written warning from the club management
- d. may serve a period of suspension
- e. be subject to a fine
- f. The I.League may impose a fine and/or suspension of player registration on the club.
- g. Prohibited from participating in activities organized by I. League.

## YOUNG PLAYERS :

- a. The club or I.League may notify the parents or guardians of the player concerned of any breach of the Code of Ethics

### 3. MATCH OFFICIALS

**Match officials are responsible for promoting high standards of conduct in the game. Match officials must comply with all rules listed, including;**

- a. be honest and impartial at all times
- b. apply the LOTG, regulations, Manual, and other official circulars fairly and consistently
- c. officiate matches in a positive, calm, and confident manner
- d. follow up on all cases of violence, aggression, unsportsmanlike behavior, foul play and other violations
- e. Not tolerate offensive, insulting or abusive language or behavior from players and team officials.
- f. support fellow match officials at all times
- g. set a positive example by behaving well to the players and team officials
- h. provide positive example by promoting good behavior and showing respect to everyone involved in the game
- i. communicate with the player and promoting *fair play*
- j. respond in a clear, calm and confident manner to any requests for appropriate clarification from the team captain
- k. prepare physically and mentally for each match
- l. complete and submit accurate and clear reports within the time limit specified for the match being officiated.
- m. not publicize anything about the match in any mass media (including social media, television broadcasts, radio, or print media—either directly or indirectly)
- n. report any offer, gifts, or access in any form given by the team, supporters, or any parties before, during and after the match

**If the match officials do not comply with the rules listed, the following actions may be taken:**

- a. fulfil calling Committee Referee PSSI
- b. fulfil calling Committee Competition PSSI

#### 4. SPECTATORS / SUPPORTERS

All spectators and supporters shall shared responsibility to set a good example and help create a positive environment where all can enjoy the game. Spectators and supporters must abide by all the rules, including:

- a. Purchase official match tickets
- b. Do not bring prohibited objects into the stadium that can interfere with the course of the match, such as:
  - *flares* , fireworks , *smoke bombs* , whistles, lasers, *firecrackers* , devices that cause noises;
  - throwing objects in to pitch;
  - banners bearing messages and/or displaying images with elements of racist, politics, hate speech, provocative and discriminatory;
- c. No pitch invasion;
- d. Not doing chants or other things containing racial, political, hate speech, provocative, and discriminatory that can be categorized as a disciplinary violation.
- e. not misuse supporting facilities that are not in accordance with their function, including but not limited to the use of fire hydrants and/or other supporting facilities.
- f. Support the team
- g. Respect and honor all referee's decision
- h. Remain behind the perimeter line and within the designated spectator area
- i. Let the coach do his jobs, and not confusing the players by telling them what to do
- j. encourage players to respect opponents, referees, and match officials
- k. support players positively, and no hate speech
- l. not tolerate insulting or abusive language or behavior.

**If spectators and supporters do not comply with the rules listed, the following actions can be taken:**

- a. given a verbal warning from the club or I. League management.
- b. Comply with a call-up to meet with the club, I.League or authorities
- c. fulfil a call-up to meet with the club management
- d. required to leave the stadium by the match officials
- e. requested by club not to attend upcoming matches
- f. I.League may impose fines and/or suspensions at the club
- g. The club has the right to seek liability in the form of compensation for the damage caused

- h. If, in a riot case, it is not possible to find and determine the perpetrator of the riot, then the PSSI Disciplinary Committee imposes sanctions on the club or body deemed to have a connection with the attacker whose identity is unknown.
- i. If proven to have committed *pitch invasion* , racism, vandalism, carrying and/or lit *flares, fireworks, smoke bombs, whistles, lasers, firecrackers*, misuse of fire *hydrants*, they will be subject to sanctions in the form of a ban on entering the stadium 5 (five) times. If there is a repetition of this offense, there will be an additional sanction of a ban on entering the stadium 10 (ten) times and continues to apply multiples.
